# ROBOT Group on the Warpath!







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This is the first time that the committee has been able to apologise for postponing our February talk. Our speaker will be back, but in the mean time we send our very best wishes to him. Please get in touch on 822 864 if you bought tickets and have not been refunded. Or keep your tickets until Dr Mick Street is able to return. Hopefully many of you enjoyed David Ushers Talk on 31st March. (If this Calendar has come out early, you may still be able to enjoy it!) that sounds surreal, but you know what I mean. Getting back to gardening:


I hope your spring bulbs have been inspirational and have not been wrecked by weather or slugs. At the time of writing this, my snowdrops are past their best, but their seed boxes are swelling nicely. If you want to encourage your snowdrops to multiply, now is the time to dig them up and separate the clumps. Make sure you plants them at the same level as they had been growing and plant them straight away.

Don't be too hasty to tidy your daffodils and other spring bulbs. When they have finished flowering, just deadhead. The leaves make food which fattens the bulb and you will then have a better display next year.

Cherry and plum trees can be pruned once their leaf buds have opened.

Sow annuals such as Nigella, single flowered marigolds, oregano and borage to attract insect. Continue to sow beetroot, carrot, radish, summer cauliflowers, spring onions, peas and perpetual spinach.

Don't be too enthusiastic or should I say, impatient, planting out tender crops and bedding plants yet. We may still have frosts to catch us out.

Potato in a Bucket Challenge for young gardeners.

There is still time to plant a potato in a very large pot or old bucket (with drainage holes). If you are under 16 and up for a challenge hurry to the Community Shop and get your free potato and information sheet . Just ask for a competition potato. If they have all gone, ask the shop to phone Pam on 822 864.

# Talaton Parish Council Report

### REPORT BY THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

EDDC Cllr Skinner provided an update of EDDC's activities including being investigated for alleged bullying and staff resigning; planning applications at Hawkchurch re solar energy battery storage system; housing allocations; sewage and South West Water accountability. Cllr Skinner was thanked for his report

### TO FURTHER DISCUSS PLANS FOR THE CORONATION CELEBRA-TIONS AND CONFIRMATION OF COUNCIL'S SUB-COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP

It was confirmed that the councillors on the Council's Coronation Sub-Ctte, were Cllrs Lenehan, Woods and Walker. The Clerk was a committee member but in the capacity of a member of the public. The celebrations would be a Council organised event, to satisfy insurance requirements. The Clerk had ascertained that the Council's current insurance policy would cover the event (with no increase in premium) subject to a Special Events form being completed. A lot of progress had been made. A meeting had been held on 9<sup>th</sup> February and a further meeting was planned for Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March.

### PLANNING ITEMS

i. To consider Application - Ref. No: 23/0261/FUL - Mrs E Pascoe, Moor Farm, Talaton. EX5 2RF - Conversion of a barn to a one bedroom dwelling This was a resubmission of application reference 22/1909/FUL, which had been approved in November 2022. The re-submitted application revised the car parking and surface water attenuation location and set out additional site landscaping. There was no change to the dwelling proposed. The Council **RESOLVED** i. to support the application and ii. that it's previous comments re application 22/1909/Ful would apply to this application

<u>ii. To consider Application – Ref. No: 22/2561/LBC – Dr Rafik Taibjee, Stoney Court, Talaton. Exeter. EX5 2RJ - Install on shed 1 3no. solar PV; shed 2 4no. solar PV and shed 3 6no. solar PV on side east elevation.</u>

A site visit took place on 25<sup>th</sup> February. The Council **RESOLVED** to support the application as the proposed works would help to maintain the integrity of a valuable listed building and also make the building sustainable

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED



Dan Wood DCC's Highway Officer advised of the following:-

i.He had put Talaton forward under the parish remark scheme, in the new financial year, (this would be for any white line remarking's etc).

ii. In regards to the Larkbeare erosion he had put forward the haunch for cleaning, this should then allow the water not to pond, meaning the pothole repair would last longer. However it was reported that the pothole repair now needed urgent attention. (The Clerk to report the issue)

iii. He attended the site regarding the cracking on the footpath outside the Talaton Inn. He advised that it would not be considered to be a safety defect in accordance with DCC's policy and therefore he would not be taking any immediate further action.

The following were also reported by councillors:-

i. The overgrown hedges at Wildwood and opposite Hillside, had now been trimmed back

ii.The signpost at Newtown Corner was pointing the wrong way and required to be re-sited and properly secured. The Clerk to report the issue

iii. The road was deteriorating at Woodmans Hill and towards the Talaton Inn. The pothole outside Cllr Bos's house was deteriorating further and now required urgent attention. (The Clerk to report the issue again).

iv.Cllr Peters had now planted the hedge beyond the cottages at the Beacon. The Chairman on behalf of the Council wished to express her thanks to Cllr Peters for carrying out this work

It was AGREED that information about the role be included in the Calendar


## MINOR WORKS VOLUNTEER(S)

Details had already been sent to councillors but could be re-sent ii.Purdah commences on 27<sup>th</sup> March until 4<sup>th</sup> May and the implications of holding the annual parish meeting during this period had been notified to all councillors



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



Areas that a Tree Warden could choose to be involved with include: -


- Champion their local trees and woods

# NEW PROCEDURES FOR VOTERS AT THE LOCAL ELECTIONS THURSDAY 4<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2023

# **Voter ID at Polling Stations**

Following the passing of the Elections Act 2022, the local elections to be held on Thursday  $4^{\rm th}$  May 2023

for councillors on East Devon District Council, East Devon Parish and Town councils, will require individuals who wish to vote in person, including those acting as a proxy on behalf of another individual, to produce an accepted form of photographic ID to prove their identity before they can be issued with a ballot paper. Postal voters will not be affected by the requirement to provide photo ID at the polling station.

## This will apply at:

UK parliamentary by-elections

- Recall petitions
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections
- Local government elections in England

The requirement for voter ID to be provided at UK Parliamentary General elections will only take effect for polls after 5 October 2023.

### Identity Documents that Will be Accepted

- UK passport
- A passport issued by an EEA state or Commonwealth country
- UK Photo driving license (full and provisional)
- A driving license issued by the Channel Islands, Isle of Man or an EEA state
- A biometric immigration document
- A proof of age ID card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) hologram. These include:
  - Citizen Card
  - o My ID Card
  - NUS Totutm ID Card
  - Validate UK Card
  - Young Scot Card
  - One ID 4 U Card
- Military ID card (MOD Form 90)
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disable Person's Bus Pass
- Ovster 60+ Card
- Freedom Pass
- Blue Badge
- Voter Authority Certificate
- National identity card issued by an EEA state

IF YOU CAN'T MEET THE AFOREMENTIONED
REQUIREMENTS THEN PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING
ALTERNATIVE PROVISION:-

You can apply for photo ID to vote (called a 'Voter Authority Certificate')

Use this service to apply for a 'Voter Authority Certificate'. You can use it to vote in person in some UK elections and referendums. You cannot use it as proof of identification for any other reason.

You only need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate if:

- · you do not have accepted photo ID
- · you no longer look like the photo on your ID
- the name on your photo ID is different to your name on the electoral register


If the name on your photo ID is different, you can register to vote again or take a document with you to vote that proves that you have changed your name.

### IMPORTANT!

Before you apply for a Voter Authority Certificate, check if you already have accepted photo ID and when you need it to vote.

## Applying for photo ID to vote

It's free to apply. You'll need:



- a recent, digital photo of yourself
- · your National Insurance number

You can still apply if you do not have a National Insurance number. You'll need to provide other documents to prove your identity, for example a birth certificate, bank statement and utility bill.

# A New Old Tradition

In mid-January at Talaton, East Devon, the weather was dry and the villlagers met at the Talaton Inn to begin their wassail. This was the first time in our knowledge that Talaton has held a public wassail - certainly in recent history. The wassail at the next village of Whimple is a well-established tradition held on old Twelfth Night each year with a procession around local orchards; Talaton was not looking to rival this event. The Talaton Wassail was in many ways a last-minute event this year and came together in a pleasing fashion.

When we realised we had a local event cancellation so Otter Morris would be available to dance, a quick wassail wish list was drawn up and we went about constructing the event. It wasn't entirely certain we'd manage to run the event but in such a community it's always heart-warming to experience how things can come together when everyone has a will and is so generous with their time.

First on the list was apple trees. Which trees would we wassail and how could we put together a village procession were the questions. The church has trees as do many private gardens in the village. The residents of Stoney Court, Ty Rowley and Rafik Taibjee offered their hospitality and Lizzie Pridmore approached the church of St James the Great so a procession route was agreed starting at the The Talaton Inn. We would need somebody to officiate and bless the wassail, Lizzie took this role and organised the blessing and collection of apples for the ceremony whilst Anissia Halwyn organised the toast we needed to take to the trees.

Next, a song, surely we needed our own song? There are so many wonderful wassail songs but we wanted something with a Devon connection. Kat Blockley had written a wassail inspired by Devon apple varieties so this song become the Wassail for Talaton, East Devon. The song references Devon cider apples Slack-Ma-Girdle, Crimson Queen, and Devon Quarrenden. We are very grateful for Becky Springall and the members of Tale Valley Choir who joined us in such fine voice to bring it to life.

And what about wassail royalty? Arwen Springall and Eira Halwyn along with their families designed and wore wonderful outfits including splendid headgear inspired by the hedgerow and lanterns to light the way. They learned their verse to recite at each tree we blessed and the villagers and band joined to create the noise required to wake the trees and clear the air.

It was clear that a procession isn't much of a procession without a processional tune so this was on our wish list too. Jon Springall kindly considered what might be an appropriate tune. 'The Triumph' was selected from the playing of Fred Pidgeon and was played with vigour by local musicians and members of the Otter Morris band as the procession moved between venues.

As the list progressed, a central element of the wassail was not yet in place – the cider. We are most grateful to Jill Courtney and Courtneys of Whimple for their donation of local Devon cider and apple juice for our toast and to Ty and Rafik for creating such tasty, mulled drinks with it.

To help us create the required song and dance once Lizzie had blessed the wassail, Otter Morris gave us a good send off from the Talaton Inn with their dance 'Honiton Lacemakers' which is danced to 'The Triumph' and they also danced at the church. As we returned to the Talaton Inn after wassailing the trees, East Devon's Otter Morris danced Brimfield at the door before the pub opened and the joyful procession of wassailers crowded in to warm at the fire. We sang a last rousing Wassail before the folk session



with regular musicians from the Tale Valley Sessions began.

The wassail turned out to be a resounding success and was well attended by villagers so we're encouraged to run it again next year as a 'new old tradition' earlier in January. A warm and grateful 'thank you' is extended to everyone listed above, Maria and Jan at the pub and all those who attended and who made the wassail such a joy. We wish everyone a fine harvest and a prosperous year, Wassail!

# My experience of the late queen's coronation

For the coronation Middlesex Grammar Schools were allocated places on the Victoria Embankment to watch the procession. My Grammar school were allocated some spaces. The spaces were allocated to pupils by drawing lots. I was lucky enough to get one of the places for my school year.

On the day we had to be at school early and were taken up to Westminster on a London Transport double decker bus. We were dropped off some way from the embankment and walked to our allotted places on the fabricated terracing by the Thames. I remember it was raining so was glad I had a pack a mac. While we were walking there was a sudden cheer from the crowed, we learnt that this was because word was spreading (no mobile phones then) that Edmund Hillary and Sherpa Tensing had reached the summit of Everest.

When we were in our position we waited patiently for the procession. There was sporadic outbreaks of singing patriotic songs. When the procession eventually came it was an amazing spectacle, soldiers, sailors, airmen, bands all in their finery, then the carriages with the dignitaries. I particularly remember Queen Salote of Tonga as her carriage was open despite the weather, she looked amazing. Then the coronation coach with the soon to be crowned Queen Elizabeth, fantastic experience.

As the procession was to return from the Abbey by a different route as soon as it had passed, we returned to our bus and back to school. When I arrived home, I found our house packed with family and neighbors. My father had bought a television (black and white 12 inch screen), the front room was packed as everyone watched. I was just in time to see the crown placed on the queens head.

After the ceremony was over my aunt and uncle took my cousin and I up to Buckingham Palace where we saw the Queen come onto the balcony and wave. There was a massive crowd.


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# Rainfall at the Cobblers/Parish Hall 100 Club

# Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During February

This February certainly did not live up to it's nick-name, 'February fill Dyke' as we been have told by the Met Office that it was the driest February for 30 years. It was quite mild month in spite of the frosty spells at the beginning and end of the month. The Met Office reported that the mean average was above the average by 1.7C and Scotland and Ireland were even milder.

Rainfall was well below the average with less than 45% of the usual rain over much of the UK. A maximum temperature was recorded in Pershore in Worcestershire on 17<sup>th</sup> of 17.2C and the lowest of -8.5C at Tulloch Bridge in Inverness-shire on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

Here in Talaton we had 23 days with no rain, 9 nights of frost and a total of 12.50mms or 0.48 inches of rain in the whole month. This merger total brings up our total for the year to 4.32 inches!




