
Our redecorations of the inside of the Hall are set for early August, when bookings are quiet, and it should all look nice and fresh and more up to date when finished – hope so!

### Rainfall at the Cobblers & Parish Hall 100 Club

### Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During June

June was according to the Met Office cooler than average, with temperatures roughly 2 degrees below average, this was due to the North Westerly winds brought in colder air from the Artic!

We did have warmer weather from the 24<sup>th</sup> onwards, with some places in the Southeast of the country enjoying temperatures of over 28C, but the overall temperatures were the average, but by the end of the month it was dryer and we had slightly below average rainfall.

The Met Office always gives a mention what it calls 'extremes' and among these was a record temperature of 30.5c in Wisley in Surrey and the lowest in Kimbrace in Scotland (again) of -1.6c.and 51.5mms or over 4 inches of rain fell at Mickelden Farm in Cumbria!

Here in Talaton June was dry with only 12.5 mms or just over 0.5 inches of rain. There were 25 days with not a drop and 2 days with just a trace!

Our yearly total now stands at 25.61 inches.


Do feed tomatoes, courgettes, pumpkins and squashes.

### Didn't We Have a Loverrly Time the Day We Went to Dartmoor!

Even though we are all ROBOTS many of our number are too young to remember the song or Bangor for that matter. Anyway, so what , we had a great day walking on Dartmoor. Thirteen brave souls, bright blue skies, just over an hour on almost pothole-free roads to arrive just outside Princetown. Even the prison looked quite attractive.

A short walk downhill over the open Moor brought us to the incredible Devonport Leat. This is a man-made watercourse, built in about 1790, collecting water from a number of moorland rivers to gently meander about 27 miles to deliver water to the then new Devonport Docks. It now flows into Burrator reservoir.

Enough history, for a while. We followed the leat on a narrow path to the accompaniment of a number of birds identified and snapped by one of our number. Those of us who should have gone to Specsavers probably will have to await the pictures to fully appreciate the wildlife. Onwards to the famous aqueduct. Here the River Meavy joins the leat but more dramatically the leat tumbles down the hillside and it is the climbing of this slope that presents the only real hiccup in an otherwise level walk. Alas, that hiccup caused the rapid unbagging of the first aid kit - a kit that was on its maiden journey. Bang! one of our happy band tripped and tried to head butt a piece of Dartmoor granite sustaining a particularly nasty gash to his head. I didn't realise so much blood could be produced by a bony forehead. Anyway, after a lot of mopping and plastering the flow stopped, although a bit later on the lunch stop provide a chance to review and improve the dressings. Seriously, a lesser individual would have been justified in accepting the offer to go back but our man

hung in there and enjoyed a lunch break overlooking the great little Crazywell Pool . This is a really scenic spot but the pool has a certain spooky air and has many myths to its name- bottomless, imminent death prediction, tidal.... all rubbish. It's about 16 feet deep but very cold and it has claimed a life in the past. We had some entertainment watching two elderly gentlemen doing a bit of wild swimming.

From here, all downhill to a track and thence into Raddick Woods and the ancient Leather Tor bridge. An idyllic spot for another lunch, really. Onwards, passing an old potato cave and the fine ruins of Leather Tor Farm. Back on the old faithful leat and a slow amble through the woods to emerge on the open moor. The ROBOT archives now hold a fine picture of three of our number deep in conversation on a log – Last of the Summer Wine ??

Up the hill, back to the cars and hey, a very enjoyable and fun drop of refreshment sitting in the sun at the Warren House Inn, overlooking the vast expanse of open Moor.

#### INFORMATION FROM THE MEETING OF 3<sup>rd</sup> JULY 2024

# CO-OPTION – TO CONSIDER APPLICATIONS RECEIVED; TO CO-OPT A NEW COUNCILLOR AND TO RECEIVE THEIR DECLARA-TION OF ACCEPTANCE OF OFFICE AND TO APPROVE EXPENDITURE FOR ON-LINE COUNCILLOR TRAINING (4 HOURLY SESSIONS @£18 PER SESSION)

David Hirt was co-opted onto Talaton Parish Council. David was warmly welcomed by the Council. It was further **RESOLVED** that the cost of new Councillor on-line training (£72) should be met by the Council. The Clerk would contact David in due course to provide him with relevant information.

#### ALLOTMENTS UPDATE AND ANY ACTIONS TO BE AGREED IN-CLUDING AN UPDATE OF THE ANNUAL RISK ASSESSMENT

The Clerk had recently visited the allotments and had provided a report of her findings. It was **AGREED** that she should carry out the following:- i. write to one of the plot holders to request that the plot be tidied (those areas that were not under plastic sheeting); ii contact Matt Kingdon to ask for a quote to strim plot 5 and cover with plastic and iii write to the landlords to ask if it was possible for the water bowser which currently had ½ of its contents left, be moved to the far corner near Plot 6 of the allotments . She had written to SWW to request the potholes in the track be filled and the trees on the boundary between the allotments and the sewage treatment works be trimmed back. She had recently been contacted by a contractor working on behalf of SWW who indicated that the tree trimming work was likely to be carried out within the next 14 days. Cllr Walker had carried out a risk assessment of the allotments. In particular she had noted that the pathways were clear; the trees (aforementioned) required trimming back; the water run-off from the road was an issue re pothole in track; the fencing would require attention shortly

The Clerk provided an update with regards to the firm who was handling the Council's claim (compensation/indemnity) and which it was agreed should continue to be pursued.

## PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED AND TO AGREE ANY FINANCIAL PROVISION (IF APPLICABLE)

i.Kyle Walker (DCC Highways Office) had responded to the following issues raised by the Council:- markings on the stretch of road on which there was a serious accident

Reply `We are led by the policy in situations like this and where the policy is unambiguous there is no room for discretion I'm afraid. I regularly get faded "slow" markings reported and in all instances, the response is the same that they do not meet the policy for remarking as a safety defect. Markings such as this will be remarked as of parish remark programme. Unfortunately I am not able to provide an update on the parish remark`

#### ii. Other DCC Matters


a. The Clerk had requested Kyle investigate the raised footpath between the steps at Orchard Close towards Beech House, next to the pub, in view of the potential health and safety issues. The Council had raised this before as it posed a risk to the elderly residents of the bungalows at Orchard Close and the adjacent property 'Bankside', many of whom were disabled or with limited mobility. Since the footpath had been dug up for infrastructure some years ago, it now sloped down towards the road, making it difficult and frightening for the residents to use, exposing them to the risk of a fall onto the road 3-4 feet below.

b.The Clerk had previously reported to Kyle the damaged chevron safety sign lying on the verge of the railway bridge (leaving Talaton heading to Fairmile). It had still not been re-sited in the correct position. The Clerk would chase up c.The Clerk to advise Kyle that the hedge between Beech House and the Orchard Close bungalows required trimming back – it was leaning over, resulting in access being slightly impeded

d.DCC had confirmed that the pot holes at Talaton Cross to Beacon Cross had been added to the list of works. It had also advised that the pothole from Beacon Cross to Larkbeare Cross would either require further investigation or a repair actioned which would be carried out before 9<sup>th</sup> Sept

e.Lady Anne Bowles wished to report the pot holes on Rosemary Lane (the part under DCC Highways control). The Clerk would pursue this with DCC f.iii. Other Matters

g. The replacement trees (beyond the cottages at the Beacon), had been cut down again (this was the second lot of trees that had received this treatment!) h. The issue of the railway bridge where small oak trees were growing out of it, had been acknowledged by Network Rail who would deal with it but no time-scale had been given



### Talaton Parish Council Report Cont'd

### TO CONSIDER PARISHIONER'S REQUEST FOR SPEED CAMERAS AND POSSIBLE BIRD CULL

The Council had received a request for it to consider these two issues. However it could not legally organise a bird cull as the bird activity appeared to be prevalent on private land and it would be a matter for the land owner(s) to seek the requisite licence to carry out the cull. With regards to a 'Community Speed Watch' being carried out in the village, it was **RESOLVED** that this should be pursued. Cllr Walker indicated that she would be willing to coordinate a group if other volunteers came forward. There needed to be four volunteers in total, and registration was an on-line process. It was further **RE-SOLVED** that the Initiative be advertised in the Calendar with a request for volunteers to come forward and that training would need to be undertaken by the volunteers.

### TO PROVIDE UPDATE ON GRANTS AWARDED BY THE COUNCIL IN DECEMBER 2023

- i. **i.The Parochial Church Council ('PCC')** advised that the application was for the band at the carol singing in December and it was also very grateful for funding received for the same purpose in a previous year
- ii. ii.Knit and Natter advised that it had used all of the grant monies and it was now using the money raised at the `How d'ye Do` to fund their projects.
- iii. iii. Tale Valley Trust advised that the grant monies were being used with controlling the Himalayan Balsam in the parish along the river corridor which work started on June 20th and was running until the end of August. It was noted by the Council that the balsam was particularly dreadful this year


### PAYTHERDEN SOLAR FARM COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND- UP-DATE
