



Talaton Parish Council Report

The following are major items from the minutes but a full copy of the minutes may be viewed on both Parish Noticeboards and on the Parish Web site www.talatonparishcouncil.co.uk

To consider Planning Application - 22/1921/LBC - Honeysuckle Thatch – Proposed single storey extension on south elevation and to include the removal in part of external wall on south elevation to facilitate extension – after Consideration a vote was taken with a unanimous decision to submit a neutral response. Cllr Gray did not take part in the vote. Proposed by Cllr Lenehan, seconded by Cllr Bos. The following comment to be submitted to EDDC "The *PC submit a neutral response to this application and defer to the relevant authority as this is a listed building. It is hoped that consideration will be given to the comment submitted by a neighbour regarding the run off from the property being a possible flood risk."*


To consider Planning Application - 21/2045/FUL - Land North of The Shrubbery

Escot Park - Amended plans for consultation. These amendments relate to Provision of an updated noise report (received 6 September 2022) – (Cllrs Hawkins and Wood declared an interest and will not take part). after consideration a vote was taken with a unanimous decision to object to the application. Proposed by Cllr Walker, seconded by Cllr Lenehan. The following comments to be sent to EDDC "Talaton PC object to this planning application. We agree completely with Chris Hariades, EDDC Landscape Architect, whose report confirms that this retrospective application fails to meet EDDC Local Plan strategy 3 and 7, and policies D1, D2 and D3. The appearance of the site has been of great concern to us and our residents, many of whom have submitted their views on this application.

With regard to the updated noise survey, the very nature of the sound of shooting is intrusive and there is no guarantee that the quieter cartridges 410/420 will be used. "

Planning Meeting held on the 27th October 2022

To consider Planning Application – - 22/0783/MFUL - Land East Of Rutton, Rull Lane Whimple - Amended plans for consultation. These amendments relate to Provision of revised plans/details relating to an amended site layout, substation layout, flood risk and drainage, ecology and biodiversity, landscaping, panel appearance, arboricultural constraints and proposed fencing – after consideration a vote was taken to object to the application. Proposed by Cllr Walker, seconded by Cllr Boss, all in favour. The following comment to be sent to EDDC "The PC objects to the application and our original comments still stand. Whilst we understand the necessity for renewable energy our major concern is the preservation of agricultural land for food security."



Meeting held on the 2nd November 2022

To consider Planning application 22/2001/FUL - 22/0798/FUL - Talaton Farm Cottage – amended plans- Internal alterations, external alterations, conversion of existing access/drive and existing drive to a garden. Following a site visit and discussion the following comment to be sent to EDDC - "Talaton Parish Council are only responding to the external aspects of this application. Given the listed status of the building, we defer to the expertise of other consultees for all aspects relating to internal changes to the property. Following a site visit and discussion, the PC voted unanimously to support the external aspect of the application, specifically those pertaining to the relocation of the drive. Access from and to the highway remains the same, and all other proposed changes have no impact on neighbours or road users. We do however, have some concerns over the removal of the low height brick walls immediately in front of the property. In this regard. we again defer to the expertise of other consultees".

Proposed by Cllr Lenehan, seconded by Cllr Gray, all in favour

Parish Maintenance- items requiring attention and update on items reported. Items to be reported-

- Potholes on the road just before the Talaton sign coming from Bittery a) Cross to Talaton Cross, also potholes before Talaton Cross down from the bus shelter
- White Lines lines faded on the bend at Lake Corner at Escot going tob) wards Fairmile
- C) Road eroded at Larkbeare to be reported again

AVIAN INFLUENZA (Bird Flu)

From 7th November 2022, it will be a legal requirement for all bird keepers to keep their birds housed and to follow stringent biosecurity measures to protect their flocks. This applies whether keepers have commercial flocks, or just a few birds in a backyard. Link to the housing order:- Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs [Logo] (publishing service.gov.uk)

The decision was made by the UK's Chief Veterinary Officer, as the UK continues to face its largest ever outbreak of avian influenza – with over 70 cases since the start of October.

You should be vigilant for any signs of disease in your birds and seek prompt advice from your vet if you have any concerns.

You can help protect your birds and prevent avian flu by maintaining good biosecurity on your premises, including:

- · housing or netting all poultry and captive birds
- minimising direct and indirect contact between poultry and captive birds and wild birds including making sure that their feed and water is not accessible to wild birds.
- · preventing access by poultry and captive birds to ponds and watercourses
- cleansing and disinfecting footwear and equipment before and after contact with poultry and captive birds (or changing into clean footwear before tending to your birds)
- · regularly cleaning and disinfecting hard surfaces in areas where birds are kept
- reducing the movement of people, vehicles or equipment to and from areas where poultry and captive birds are kept, to minimise contamination, and using effective vermin control
- keeping fresh approved disinfectant at the right concentration for use at farm entrances and before entering poultry and captive bird housing or enclosures

You can also find a self-assessment checklist at the above link to help you put the measures in place, as well as more information about the virus.

You can keep up to date with any future changes by regularly visiting the avian influenza section on the government website, and by registering for email or text alerts - www.gov.uk/guidance/apha-alert-subscription-service

The risk to public health from the virus is very low, however it is important that people don't pick up sick or dead birds.

You should call the Defra helpline on 03459 33 55 77 if you find:

- · one or more dead bird of prey or owl
- 3 or more dead gulls or wild waterfowl (swans, geese and ducks)
- . 5 or more dead birds of any species

The Food Standards Agency advice remains unchanged, that avian influenza poses a very low food safety risk for UK consumers. Properly cooked poultry and poultry products, including eggs, are safe to eat.


If you keep poultry or other birds, wash your hands and clean and disinfect your footwear before tending to your birds


AVIAN INFLUENZA PREVENTION ZONE

Essential biosecurity and housing requirements for chicken and turkey keepers

- Keep your chickens and turkeys housed. If you do not have purposebuilt housing you could use a garden shed or polytunnel, as long as there is adequate light, space and ventilation.
- Ensure there are no leaks or other forms of water ingress to the building.
- Seek guidance from your vet if you have concerns regarding your birds' health and welfare needs due to the new housing requirememnts.
- If it is impossible for you to completely house your birds, you must separate them from wild birds. Provide an enclosure or temporary structure that is fully netted (holes no greater than 2-5cm diameter)
- If there are any gaps in your housing where wild birds could get in, block them, or cover with netting.
- Partially enclosed birds must be kept separate from any fully housed birds.
- Feed and water must be provided indoors or undercover.







- Store bedding inside to reduce the risk of contamination.
- Make your entire premises unattractive to wild birds. Use bird scarers, foils or streamers.
- Cleanse and disinfect footwear before and after tending to your birds. If you own more than 50 birds, you must place foot dips containing government approved disinfectant, at the correct dilution rate, at all entry and exit points. This is also advised for less than 50 birds.
- Clean and disinfect hard surfaces regularly.
- Clean and disinfect equipment and vehicles to avoid disease spread between premises.
- Minimise the movement of people, vehicles and equipment to and from bird areas and keep records of movements.
- You must keep records of movement of poultry, captive birds and eggs. This is in addition to the usual rules on recording bird deaths and medicine usage when you check your birds.



Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During October

Most of the time in October the weather was warmer than average, with a notable lack of frosts. The weather was predominantly unsettled with very few dry spells. The UK mean temperature was 1.8 C above the long-term average. The Maximum temperature were nearly 3.0 C above the average! The Met Office state this was the 7th warmest October since 1884!. Rainfall was broadly above average, the UK. The Maximum temperature in the UK was 22.9 C recorded at Kew Gardens in London on the 29th, and the lowest of -3.8 C was recorded on 15th in Aboyne in Aberdeenshire. On the 15th 102.6ms or 4.10 inches of rain fell at Honister Pass in Cumbria in 24 hours!!

Here in Talaton I measured 131.0ms or 5.24 inches of rain for the month and had to go back 12 months to October 2021 to find a wetter monthly total which had a huge 10.52 inches.

There were 8 days in the month with no rain, and our yearly total now stands at 21.01 inches.

Digging over bare ground and adding well-rotted organic manure Harvesting leeks, root crops and winter brassicas



Don't forget to leave some water out for birds and other wildlife.

When it is too wet and windy, why not sit down in a comfy chair and start planning for next year.

And..... remember to visit our stall at the How D'ye Do on Sat 3rd Dec If you have a spare moment, why not wander around your garden, and count just how many plants are flowering. They will be important sources of food for visiting insects.






