### Rainfall at the Cobblers

### Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During October

October was a 'rather typical month' according to the Met Office, showing rainfall a little below average and temperature only just above, according to records taken from 1991 /2020.

An Atlantic front brought heavy rain in on 8<sup>th</sup> /9<sup>th</sup>. I measured 39 mls or just over 1 ½ inches between 8/9<sup>th</sup>! On the 20<sup>th</sup> storm Ashley blew in with rain and strong winds.

The whole of the UK was warmer than average, and we have now been told that it was the warmest October ever!!


Well since records began!





#### INFORMATION FROM THE MEETING OF 6th NOVEMBER 2024

### GRANTS – CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AND TO MAKE DECISIONS ACCORDINGLY

It was **RESOLVED** to make the following payments:-

Talaton Parish Hall - £450 towards the costs of a projector.

Knit and Natter - £150 for materials for ongoing projects

Tale Valley Trust - £250 for specific equipment

It was **AGREED** that grant giving be permanently changed to the November meeting each year

#### **ACCOUNTS**

The Internal Auditor's ½ year report re the Council's accounts was noted. The Clerk reported that the Chair had also examined the last six months of the Council's accounts which she was happy with

#### ALLOTMENTS UPDATE - ANY ACTIONS TO BE AGREED


i. The Clerk advised that all the plots had now been let, other than plot 6 because of water logging issues. Invoices would be sent out at the end of the month for the annual rental

ii.It was **AGREED** that the tenant of Plot 5A be permitted to cover her plot for several months and then cultivate it in the Spring

iii. The landlords of the allotments had requested that the rubbish which had been left (deck chairs; old water butts and wooden doors etc) be removed. The Clerk advised that the obligation on the Council (as the tenant) and in accordance with the allotment lease, was to ensure that the allotments were kept free of refuse. After some discussion, Cllr Peters very kindly agreed to remove the debris. He was warmly thanked for his offer.

#### GRIT BINS UPDATE

A list of all the bins and plan of locations had been circulated to all councillors. All the bins had been checked and were full, (other than the bin near the garages near Rydon Cottages and Lashbrooke Farm. Cllr Peters kindly offered to check these bins).



### Talaton Parish Council Report Cont'd

### CHRISTMAS EVENT MATTERS – FINAL APPROVAL OF RISK ASSESSMENT AND TO CONSIDER ANY RELATED MATTERS AND TO MAKE DECISIONS (AS REQUIRED)

The final Risk Assessment had been circulated to all councillors. It was **RE-SOLVED** to approve the final format and it was **AGREED** for the Clerk to forward a copy of the same to the Church.

### LOCALITY FUND – TO CONSIDER (AND MAKE DECISIONS) ABOUT ANY PROJECTS THAT MAY MEET THE FUND CRITERIA AND TO CONSIDER ANY QUOTES OBTAINED


Details of how the DCC's Locality Fund worked, had been e-mailed to councillors. It was **AGREED** that the item be deferred to the December meeting as a quote for the cost of repainting the telephone box could be considered at this meeting as a possibility for Locality funding

#### S106 AND CIL MONIES – TO CONSIDER POSSIBLE PROJECTS

The Clerk had checked with EDDC to see if the Parish was eligible for S106/CIL funds. EDDC confirmed that funds in the sum of £3,367.11 were available to the Council. The S106 funds could only be used on 'the councils cost of maintaining open space' eg play, sport, open space, allotments, recreation'. There was much debate ranging from a suggested children's play area but it appeared there was no land available for this purpose in the Parish. It was therefore **AGREED** that the Clerk contact SWW for a quote for the installation of a water pipe for the allotments. The Clerk to also check with EDDC whether a water pipe would be eligible for funding under the S106 scheme

### PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND AN UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED AND TO AGREE ANY FINANCIAL PROVISION (IF APPLICABLE)

- i. The Chevron sign had been re-erected near the railway bridge
- ii. SWW had investigated the leak outside 1 High Ridge but they considered the drain issue was the responsibility of DCC. The Clerk had referred the matter to the new DCC Highway Officer but had not yet received a response.
- iii. It was noted that the pothole at Escot had been repaired and one of the potholes at Rydon had been repaired
- iv. Cllr Hirt had picked up a 30mph sign that had become detached from its post at Hillside. The Clerk had reported this to the DCC Highways Officer but to date had not received a response
- v. Cllr Hirt kindly agreed to secure the finger post opposite the Newtown junction (to ensure it was pointing in the correct position)

**TO DECIDE DATE FOR ANNUAL PARISH MEETING IN APRIL 2025**It was **AGREED** that the Annual Parish Meeting should take place on 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2025

#### TO REPORT ANY DELEGATED DECISIONS OF THE COUNCIL

i.24/1904/FUL | Proposed erection of a farm succession dwelling | Land East Of Keepers Cottage Talaton

`Talaton Parish Council supports this application for a Succession Dwelling subject to it having an Agricultural Tie. We are pleased to note the removal of the kitchen wing, reducing the size of the property, as recommended by EDDC in their pre-application advice. We would point out that the application still refers to a 3 bedroomed property when it is in fact 4 (3 x first floor and 1 x guest bedroom ground floor)`.

A parishioner had forwarded the Council a copy of her letter which she had sent to EDDC regarding the application with her comments. However the parishioner was supportive of the application
