Once again, a big thank you to Jan, Marie at the Talaton Inn.



Talaton Parish Council Report

The following are major items from the minutes but a full copy of the minutes may be viewed on both Parish Noticeboards and on the Parish Web site www.talatonparishcouncil.co.uk

Meeting held on the 7th December 2022

To consider Planning application 22/2525/FUL – 11 Woodmans Orchard-single storey side extension and garage conversion-- Following a site visit and discussion the following comment to be sent to EDDC – "Talaton Parish Council support the application which will enhance the existing building and is in keeping with neighbouring properties". Proposed by Cllr Walker, seconded by Cllr Bos. Cllr Peters abstained as he had not been present at the site visit, the other 4 Cllrs all supported the application.


To discuss vacancy for Clerk- closing date for applications is the 13th December. There has been 1 applicant so far and she met the PC informally during the Grant Giving session. It was proposed that if no other applicants apply then a formal offer of employment would be offered as she is an experienced and qualified clerk. Proposed by Cllr Wallker, seconded by Cllr Lenehan, all in favour.

To discuss plans for the Coronation – a sub-committee to be set up. As per the Jubilee Celebrations a budget of £3000 to be allocated to allow the purchase of supplies and services, the majority of the costs will be recouped through ticket sales. Proposed By Cllr Lenehan, seconded by Cllr Walker, all in favour.

Parish Maintenance- items requiring attention and update on items reported- the road erosion at Larkbeare does not meet the criteria for a safety problem. Escot Corner has been added to the non-safety lining defects job list and will be actioned when resources allow. The potholes on the road from Talaton Cross to Bittery Cross are due to be filled. The erosion of the road around the manhole cover opposite the Hall has been actioned. Potholes to be reported.

Potholes – on the road past Rydon Farm to Blue Anchor on the corner by Blackpit Lane

Matters of urgency-as a follow up to the production of Kindertransport,



the PC has been asked if funding would be available to form a Talaton Kindertransport Archive- the matter needs to discussed in full to see what form of Archive it would be and whether it could perhaps be incorporated with a general Talaton Archive.

Meeting held on the 4th January 2023

Prior to the meeting the Grant Giving session took place and the following grants were awarded

CLERK TO THE PARISH COUNCIL - FAREWELL TO DENISE MAIN AND INTRODUCTION OF THE NEW CLERK

Denise Main who had served the Council admirably for several years as the Parish Clerk was warmly thanked for her many years of service and was presented with a gift in recognition of this. Christine McIntyre was welcomed as the new Clerk

BUDGET AND PRECEPT 2023/24

A Budget of £10,264 and Precept £8990 (the monies requested from EDDC for parish expenditure) were approved. It was noted that due to the reserves held by the Council, only a minimal increase in the precept was required

TO DISCUSS PLANS FOR CORONATION CELEBRATIONS

A committee/working group would need to be formed to progress the event. Cllr Lenehan would get matters underway and liaise with potential members of the committee/working group. It was likely that the first meeting would be held in February. The Clerk expressed an interest in becoming involved

PARISH MAINTENANCE ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND ON ITEMS REPORTED

a. Pot hole between the entrance of Rydon Farm and Rydon House

b. Pothole near Blackpit Lane

Talaton Parish Council Report Cont'd

- c. Pot hole near Newtown corner junction
- d. Chase up marking of white lines at Bittery Cross
- e. Drains were blocked at Newtown Cross and at Escot
- f. Complaints had been received about overgrown hedges requiring trimming (on the left-hand side past Larkbeare (the field of the proposed car park) and opposite Hillside). It was agreed that the Clerk write to the Manager of Wildwood of Escot Park in respect of the former and also write to Mr J Hansford in respect of the latter. It was noted that if the work was not carried out by the landowners (and if DCC had to deal with the issue), then both parties could be liable to incur the trimming costs which could be significantly higher than having carried out the work themselves
- g. The Clerk to write to DCC Highways re verge cutting (first week of June)
- h. The raised footpath from the Talaton Inn up to Orchard Close is cracked with potential H&S issues
- i. Fly tipping of cooker (on the way to Feniton leading up to bridge, entrance to a field). The matter would be reported. No action required by the Clerk


TO FURTHER CONSIDER PLANNING APPLICATION – 22/0783/MFUL - LAND EAST OF RUTTON RULL LANE WHIMPLE - AMENDED PLANS FOR CONSULTATION

EDDC had notified the Council of further amendments relating to the provision of revised or additional plans/details relating to an amended site layout, revised flood risk and drainage strategy, LEMP (Landscape Ecological and Biodiversity Management Plan) and replies to previous consultation responses, including photographs of grass around solar panels.

After some debate a vote was taken and it was **RESOLVED** to submit the following response to EDDC. `The Council`s original comments previously submitted to EDDC still stand (despite the latest amendments) `.

DCC 20MPH COMMUNITY SELF-ASSESSMENT REGISTER OF INTEREST

It was suggested that the Council should request restrictions be introduced in the Parish. It was **RESOLVED** that the Clerk register the Council's interest in the DCC scheme and to seek the support of the local member – DCC Cllr Iain Chubb.

Things to do in the garden:-

Place an old bucket or rhubarb forcing pot over your rhubarb crowns to help encourage some delicious early stalks.

Cover any dug soil with polythene to help warm up the soil and dry it out ready for planting next month.

Finish pruning your apple trees.

Pinch the tops out of autumn grown sweet peas to help them make bushier plants. Feed and mulch fruit trees and bushes.

If the weather is too unfriendly for work in the garden, why not keep planning what you want to grow and where you want to grow it. It is unwise to keep growing the same crop in one spot. This could cause a build up of specific pests and will certainly deplete the nutrients that particular crop uses.

It is time to chit your seed potatoes in a cool, light, frost free place.

Check stored vegetables, for signs of rot, or animal damage.

What about making some marmalade and saving the best-looking pot for our August Show!

And..... Please keep feeding the birds and making sure there is plenty of water for them.

TALATON PARISH HALL HIRE CHARGES

Main Hall £10 per hour Committee Room £5 per hour

Minimum hiring period is 2 hours and this includes setting up and clearing away. There is no additional charge for use of the kitchen or stage. A deposit is not required but the hirer will be expected to pay for breakages or any repairs required resulting from damage during the hiring period.

Discounted rates are available for regular users.

The rate for professional events is £20 per hour. For such events all tables and chairs will be set up as required and cleared away at the end of the event. The bar can be made available subject to negotiation.

Following are available for hire by Talaton residents for use away from hall:-

Cutlery & China - £10 Wine Glasses - £5 per box of 24
Tables - £1 each Padded Chairs - 50p each (internal)

Plastic Chairs - 25p each.

Gazebos 3mx3m - £10 ea (10 avail) Gazebos 6mx3m - £75 ea (2 avail)

All the above are per day.

In addition to the hiring fee a deposit is required for gazebo hire which will be returned if the items are returned in the same condition as that at the start of the hire period. The deposit for the 6mx3m gazebos is £100 and the 3mx3m gazebos is £50. Cutlery, China, cutlery and glasses must be washed prior to return.

HALL DETAILS

The Village Hall is ideal for all manner of occasions, including meetings, luncheon and dinner events, wedding parties, children's parties, fairs and concerts and exercise classes.

The main Hall is approximately 12.7m x 6.3m and can seat up to 100 people in theatre-style layout and up to 80 for dinners or lunches dependent on layout. Our licence also allows for up to 145 at standing only events.

There is a separate committee room measuring approximately 6.3m x 2.3m which can be hired on its own for small meetings etc.

The Hall benefits from a fully equipped kitchen with serving area, toilet facilities and a foyer. In addition, there are ample tables and chairs, a stage, and a lighting system for stage events.

Free WiFi is available.

STAGE

There is a stage with curtains, moveable stage steps, small room at the back for changing and toilet facilities.

KITCHEN

The well-equipped kitchen contains work surfaces for food prepping, an oven and hob, a microwave, electric water heater and 2 fridges.

There is enough crockery, glasses, and cutlery to cater for over 100 people.

HONITON 13 A Learn, live, laugh

As it starts its 30th anniversary year, Honiton u3a is looking forward to welcoming new members to enjoy the range of opportunities if offers.

Honiton u3a is for like-minded people in their third age who come together to share creative, leisure and learning activities. As well as a wide range of interest groups, members also enjoy monthly talks held at The Beehive in Honiton.

And then on February 8th, author and lecturer Todd Gray will be giving a talk entitled "Devon and Emancipation in 1834." The emancipation of en-

slaved men, women and children in 1834 created a collection of documents which allows us to understand the extent to which Devon residents were involved in slave ownership.

This lecture by one of Honiton u3a's regular and most popular speakers focuses on what the historical evidence can and cannot reveal about this issue.

Rainfall at the Cobblers

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During November & December

Most of November was warmer than average, with fewer frosts than normal. We had 1 night only with just a touch of frost.

The month was unsettled in most parts of the UK with no dry spells longer than 3 days. The UK mean temperature was 8.2 C which is 1.8 C higher than the long-term average. The Met Office tells us that November 2022 was the 3rd warmest since 1884, only 1994 and 2011 were warmer!

Rainfall was well above average. Some parts of Scotland and Northern Ireland where significantly drier than usual but other areas in Western Scotland and Southern England had **double** their average rain.

A Maximum temperature of 21.2 C was recorded in Porthmadog in Wales on the 13th, the lowest of -6.0 C was recorded in Aviemore in Scotland on the 30th In the 24 hours of 11th 115.6ms or 4.62 inches of rain fell on Achragant in Ross and Cromarty!!

Here in Talaton we had 220m or 8.78 inches of rain, when last November I measured only 0.9 inches! I usually report the number of days when no rain fell (9) but in this November. There were 4 days when had over an inch and 5 days when $\frac{1}{2}$ an inch fell, all in just 24 hours.

Our yearly total stands at 29.69 inches.

December 2022 was colder than average, (unlike any of the other months in 2022), the provisional mean temperature was 2.9 C which is 1.3C below the average. minimum, the coldest place in the UK was -8.0C in Topcliffe in North Yorkshire and the warmest place was in St James's park with 16.3C. In 24 hours on the 8th; 64,8ms or 2.59 inches fell at Honister pass in Cumbria. 11cm of snow fell at Glascarnoch in Scotland on each day of the 5th 6th and 8th. In Talaton snow fell here on 8th and did not leave us till 17th. There were frosts from the 6th till the 18th. I measured 112 ms or 4,48 inches of rain; there were 13 days with no rain; 5 days when snow lay; The total rainfall for the year was 34.69 inches.

Parish Hall 100 Club

Annual report for 2022. Was one of the warmest years on record. In February 3 named storms Dudley, Eunice and Franklin ploughed into the UK in a week in February this has never happened before. The hottest place was Coningsby in Lincolnshire with a temperature of 40.3C on the 19th of July, this was the highest temperature ever recorded in The UK. The lowest was on December 20th of -17.3C at Breamar in Scotland, July saw the Met Office's first Red Warning for extreme heat in July. The summer was the 10th driest on record. A lot of Devon saw less than 50% of normal rainfall, but the sunshine, for the UK was in the top 3 sunniest years on record.
