

Things to do in the garden

Place an old bucket or rhubarb forcing pot over your rhubarb crowns to help encourage some delicious early stalks.

Cover any dug soil with polythene to help warm up the soil and dry it out ready for planting next month.

Finish pruning your apple trees.

Pinch the tops out of autumn grown sweet peas to help them make bushier plants.

Weather too unfriendly for work in the garden? Keep planning what you want to grow and where you want to grow it. It is unwise to keep growing the same crop in one spot. This could cause a build-up of pests and will certainly deplete the nutrients that crop uses. What about making

some marmalade and saving the best looking pot for our August Show!

And...... Please keep feeding the birds and making sure there is plenty of water available to them. Blackbirds and other thrushes love apples fixed on skewers in the lawn. I even saw a black cap feeding on an apple in my garden on 8th Jan this year!


YOUNG COMMUNITY THEATRE 4ALL "The Little Prince"

The Little Prince by Antoine de Saint-Exupéry is a magical and philosophical children's story that tells about a young prince who leaves his own home, a distant planet, and travels through the universe from planet to planet until he eventually arrives on the Earth. During his journey the prince encounters various eccentric characters and through these meetings he (and we) learn valuable lessons about life, love, and human nature. This production has been adapted for the stage by Tom Samson. The Little Prince explores the themes of innocence, friendship, and the importance of seeing beyond the surface to discover deeper truths. It is most certainly a story for children but it is also much more than that and, on a deeper level, it contains a very important message for adults.

Tickets are limited to just 45 for each performance and with a cast of 16 performers are bound to sell out quickly.

Antoine de Saint-Exupéry was born in France in 1900. He was a professional aviator, novelist and poet. At the outbreak of the second world war he joined the French Airforce and when France fell to the German invasion he went to America where he continued to support the French cause by lobbying the American Government. While in America he wrote *The Little Prince* which was published in 1943. In the same year he travelled to North Africa with American troops and re-entered service as a reconnaissance pilot. He disappeared while flying over the Mediterranean in July 1944, it is presumed that he was shot down by an enemy aircraft.

TALATON PARISH COUNCIL SUPPORTS THE CLIMATE & ECOLOGY BILL

The Climate & Ecology Bill, a private member's bill currently before the House of Commons, seeks to address the challenges that this situation poses by creating a whole-ofgovernment approach to deliver a net zero and nature positive future. Based on the latest science, the Bill aims to align current UK environmental policy with the need to halt and reverse nature loss by 2030, which was goal agreed to at COP15, via the *Kunming-Montreal Framework* (22 December 2022); and reduce greenhouse gas emissions in line with a fair share of the remaining global carbon budget to give the strongest chance of limiting global heating to 1.5C, which was the goal agreed to at COP21, via the *Paris Agreement* (12 December 2015).

By bridging the gap between the UK Government's current delivery, and what has been agreed at international levels, Britain has a chance to be a world leader on the environment; seizing the opportunities of the clean energy transition, including green jobs and reduced energy bills; and boosting the UK's food and energy security.

Talaton Parish Council notes that:

The <u>Climate and Ecology Bill</u>, which has been introduced in the UK Parliament on four occasions since 2020, including most recently in the House of Commons 10 May 2023, is backed by **[168]** cross-party MPs and Peers, **[237]** local authorities, alongside the support of eminent scientists, such as Sir David King; environmental NGOs, such as The Wildlife Trusts and CPRE; businesses, such as The Co-operative Bank; and 30,000 members of the public.

The Bill would require the UK Government to develop and deliver a new environmental strategy, which would include:

- 1. Delivering a joined-up environmental plan, as the crises in climate and nature are deeply intertwined, requiring a plan that considers both together;
- 2. Reducing emissions in line with 1.5°C, ensure emissions are reduced rapidly, for the best chance of limiting warming to 1.5°C;
- 3. Not only halting, but also reversing the decline in nature, setting nature measurably on the path to recovery by 2030;
- 4. Taking responsibility for our overseas footprint, both emissions and ecological;
- 5. Prioritising nature in decision-making, and ending fossil fuel production and imports as rapidly as possible;
- 6. Ensuring that no-one is left behind, by providing for retraining for people currently working in fossil fuel industries; and
- 7. Giving people a say in finding a fair way forward through an independent and temporary *Climate & Nature Assembly*, representative of the UK population, an essential tool for bringing public opinion along with the unprecedented pace of change required.

At the meeting of Full Council on Wednesday 6th December 2023, Talaton Parish Council resolved to support the Climate and Ecology Bill and write to Simon Jupp MP to inform him that this motion has been passed, urging him to sign up to support the CE Bill (if he had not already done so). Members also resolved to write to <u>Zero</u><u>Hour</u>, the organisers of the cross-party campaign for the CE Bill, expressing its support (campaign@zerohour.uk).

Rainfall at the Cobblers

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During November

The Met office tells us that most of November was warmer than average.

The month was unsettled with no dry spells longer than a very few days. We are told that it was the third. Warmest November since 1884, only 1994 and 2011 were warmer, Rainfall was well above the average and large parts of England had double their usual monthly rainfall.

A maximum temperature of 21.2C was recorded in Porthmadog in Wales on the 13th and the lowest of -6.0C in Aviemore in Scotland. In 24 hours on 11th 115.mms or 4.6 inches fell at Achnagare again in Scotland.

In many parts of the UK roads and rail services were affected by flooding, and a land-slide held up trains outside Honiton!

Here in Talaton we had very wet weather for the first fortnight of the month when we had 128.0 mms which is well over 5 inches, and in the last part of the month only 10.50mm which is 0.4 of an inch.

I recorded 142 mm or 5.68 inches in the month with only 9 dry days. Our yearly total now stands at 38.6 inches.

Rainfall in Talaton during December 2023.

December was a wet month by any standards, I recorded 6.36 inches of rain, and we had 3 named storms during the month with Storm Gerrit affecting the UK with serious flooding in many places. There were only 9 dry days in the whole month.

The rainfall was the highest for a December in the 15 years that I have been doing these records. There were serious floods in many places, often accompanied by high winds.

December's 6.36 inches brought the total for 2023 to 45.76 inches.

Lease

The lease had been completed. The Council now had a seven year lease of the allotment site which would expire 30th November 2030.

Advertising Plots

It was **AGREED** to advertise the vacant plots (plots 3 and 6 as whole plots and plot 5a as a half plot). If there was more interest from parishioners to have half plots rather than whole plots then the Council would consider this.

New Tenancy Agreements etc

It was **AGREED** for the Clerk to send out the new tenancy agreements and supporting information to the existing tenants

Maintenance Work

Matt Kingdon had strimmed plots 3 and 6.

Water Supply

SWW had provided costings regarding water provision for the allotments. After much discussion the Council **RESOLVED** not to progress this, in view of it being cost prohibitive. However SWW had agreed to provide water butts on the site which should be delivered shortly and should assist with water provision

VILLAGE GREEN

Tree works would be carried out by the National Grid shortly. The Clerk had informed the surveyor acting for the Grid to contact the land owners solicitor, for consent to the proposed works.

UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED

The Clerk would chase up Network Rail

CLIMATE AND ECOLOGY BILL – CONSIDERATION OF REQUEST BY ZERO HOUR FOR THE COUNCIL TO SUPPORT THE BILL

1. Support the Climate and Ecology Bill;

2. Inform local residents and inform local press/media of this decision;

3. Write to Simon Jupp MP to inform him that this motion had been passed, and urge him to sign up to support the CE Bill—or thank him for already doing so;

4. Write to Zero Hour, the organisers of the cross-party campaign for the CE Bill, expressing the Council's support (councils@zerohour.uk).

TELEPHONE BOX – UPDATE ON THE UNMETERED ELECTRIC-ITY SUPPLY AND THE PROVISION OF SHELVING

The cost of the disconnection of the electricity supply, by the National Grid was as per the quote sent out to councillors (£1662.82 plus vat) The work could only be undertaken by the National Grid. It was **RESOLVED** not to proceed with the disconnection of the electricity supply, in view of the costs being prohibitive and instead ask Utility Aid to try and source a cheaper energy supplier if possible

TREES UPDATE AND DECISION OF COUNCIL AS TO WHICH VARIETIES OF REPLACEMENT TREES TO ORDER FROM THE WOODLAND TRUST (IF CONSIDERED NECESSARY)

The Vice-Chair advised that her husband had planted a number of saplings to replace the saplings that had been damaged/destroyed beyond the cottages at the Beacon. Appreciation and thanks were expressed for the work carried out by the Vice-Chair's husband. It was **AGREED** that the offer of free trees/hedging from the Woodland Trust be considered again in the future, once it was known whether any of the replacement saplings required further replacement.

Three tenants had now signed their new tenancy agreements and had made their rental payments. One tenant had terminated her half plot tenancy. Allotment plots 3, 5A,5B and 6 were now available to rent. The plots had been advertised on the notice boards, Calendar and social media. A non-parishioner was interested in having an allotment. The Council **AGREED** that if there was availability (if not enough parishioners took up the allotment plots) then a plot could be offered to the non parishioner. The Clerk had chased up SWW again regarding the water provision equipment but was still waiting to hear.

Network Rail had advised that the overgrown vegetation would be removed from the railway bridge at the start of the 24/25 financial year (when funds would be available). The Chair advised that Mr Jackson was willing to carry out the work to the wall at Orchard Close on a voluntary basis. There were a number of potholes in the vicinity of Escot that required filling in; surface water from the fields was making the problems worse. It was understood that the issue had been raised on social media (Talaton Talk) and that a parishioner had emailed CCllr Iain Chubb with evidence of the issues. The re-positioned sign at the Newtown junction was again in the wrong position (it appears the wind may have blown it out of the correct position). The Clerk would report these issues to the various authorities. However with regards to highway matters she suggested that she contact Meg Booth (Director of Climate Change, Environment and Transport) as the highway officer covering the Talaton area had either stepped down or was about to do so very shortly.

TELEPHONE BOX – UPDATE ON THE UNMETERED ELEC-TRICITY SUPPLY AND ANY OTHER ISSUES AND TO MAKE DECISIONS AS APPROPRIATE.

Utility Aid had confirmed that it was exploring the market to see if it could source a cheaper energy price for the box. They would contact the Clerk in due course with their findings. It was **RESOLVED** that the proposed shelving works to the telephone box should be carried out by Mr Jackson on a paid basis. It was reported that a catch was required on the door in order that it could shut properly and to ensure that the contents of the box were protected from the elements; the box required to be repainted and consideration would need to be given in the first instance to the specific paint required and costs etc. Gravel near the door required clearing and a paving slab put in situ

The Council's request to be considered for a government domain had been acknowledged. The Clerk would listen to an on-line presentation on 16th January to understand what was involved


