Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During December

In December I recorded 1;8 inches of rain with 17 days when no rain fell, which brought our total for the year 2024 to 27 inches.

The Met Office said that last year was 'the equal eighth wettest for the UK in a series starting from 1836.

Parts of Northern England and Scotland had more than twice their normal rainfall, and the named storms Elin; Fergus and Geret brought heavy rain, but thankfully not so bad in Devon.

February 2024 was the wettest month of last year with 138ms or 5.5 inches, fingers crossed for the coming month.


Things to do in the garden



Community Theatre 4All was formed in September 2015 and draws its membership primarily from the villages of Talaton and Whimple. Initially formed as an adult group its first production was the musical "Godspell", which was performed in St Mary's church Whimple in March 2016.

A wide range of theatrical work followed and in early March 2020 the group performed its second musical "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dream Coat", also in St Mary's church. This production, which had a cast of 50, comprised of 30 adults and 20 children, became the foundation upon which the youth section of Community Theatre 4all was built.

Following a lengthy pause, caused by Covid, Young Community Theatre 4All was formed in September 2022. Since this time the group has experimented with a wide range of theatrical productions. These have included a devised piece based upon the children's book "Where The Wild Things Are", followed by the musical "Rats!" which told the story of The Pied Piper of Hamelin. In March 2024 the group performed a specially written play, "The Little Prince" which was based on the book of the same name by Antoine De Saint-Exupéry. In July 2024 the youth group joined forces with the adult group to give a series of open-air performances of the classic story "Toad of Toad Hall".

"The King of the Golden River", the group's fifth production, is based upon the book of the same name by John Ruskin and has been especially written for the company by Tom Samson.

TALATON PARISH COUNCIL HAS A REQUEST......

You may or may not be aware that there are a number of grassed areas in the Parish which Talaton Parish Council is responsible for maintaining. The Parish Council has two paid contractors who carry out the work on the Parish Council's behalf. One contractor cuts the Moor (the village green) and the other contractor cuts the following areas:-

- 1. Beacon Cross (with seat)
- 2. Bittery Cross (with seat)
- Verge 1 Woodmans
- Verge 2 Woodmans (with shelter)
- The verge with dog bin in the centre of the village
- The verge with dog bin (near turning to New Town)
- Grassed area with phone box and seat in the centre of the village
- The verge adjoining the property 'Bankside' in the centre of the village
- 9. The two verges with 'Hillside' signs
- 10. The verge near the Parish Hall
- 11. The verge opposite the old Post Office and near the steps

It has come to our attention that some very community minded person(s) appear to have been undertaking the maintenance of a couple of verge areas on the list, (possibly unaware that the areas are the responsibility of the Parish Council) and in view of this, our contractor is currently not having to maintain them, which as you can appreciate is not an ideal situation. It is very kind of these individuals to carry out this work, however it must be pointed out that as the Parish Council's contractors have public liability insurance, then if any claims were made against them in connection with their grounds maintenance work, that their insurance policies should cover them for such eventualities. It is unlikely that the unknown individuals currently carrying out the work to the two verges will have the correct insurance in place. Therefore if any claims were made, it could have extremely serious financial repercussions for them.

It would be helpful instead, (should any person have concerns about the condition of any of the areas on the list (or any other areas in the Parish)) that they contact the Clerk clerk.talatonpc@outlook.com or Tel. 01404 814128 to report the issue to her and then she will take the matter up with the contractor or relevant body to rectify.

If there are any highway issues – eg mud on road/ footpaths/blocked drains etc then again due to the insurance implications the matter should be reported to the Clerk or alternatively can be logged on Devon County Council's webpage:https://www.devon.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/report-a-problem/

INFORMATION FROM THE MEETINGS OF 4th DECEMBER 2024 AND 8TH JANUARY 2025

COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH UPDATE

Due to a number of Parish volunteers withdrawing their services to assist with the Community Speedwatch (citing possible abusive behaviour by some motorists as the reason for withdrawal); the Speedwatch in Talaton would now have to be abandoned. The Council was of the view that this was regrettable as it had strongly supported the initiative but understood the reasons for withdrawal. There was a minimum number of four volunteers required for the initiative and unfortunately the remaining number of volunteers was insufficient to meet that requirement. Cllr Walker would inform the Devon and Cornwall Police of the decision to withdraw from the initiative and also the remaining volunteers

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL'S LOCALITY FUND 24-25 – TO CONSIDER (AND MAKE DECISIONS) ABOUT THE PROPOSED MAINTENANCE PROJECT (REPAINTING OF TELEPHONE BOX AND CLEANING AND TREATING OF FOUR BENCHES) TO BE PART FUNDED FROM THE LOCALITY BUDGET It was RESOLVED to carry out the following:-

- i. To accept the quote from Tara in the sum of £860 for the repainting of the telephone box and the treating of the four benches('the Works')
- ii. The Clerk to process an application for Locality funding to DCC in the sum of £500
- iii. iii.For the Council to agree to contribute the sum of £360 towards the costs of the Works

PLANNING MATTERS

i.24/2103/FUL Applicant: Mr Wayne Lyness Heritage - Proposal: Installation of freestand-

ing toilet block Location: Plot At Wildwood Escot Park Ottery St Mary

The Council was disappointed that no mention had been made in the planning application documents that it was a retrospective application. The work to convert an existing outbuilding into a toilet block had been carried out earlier in the year and completed in May 2024. However it was noted that the new toilet block provided much better facilities for customers, including improved accessibility and baby changing facilities. The appearance of the structure blended well within the woodland background and was not overlooked by anyone other than users of it. In conclusion the Council supported this application.

i.Consideration of Planning application 24/2635/Ful – 1 The Moor Talaton – Mr and Mrs Colin - Two storey side extension and alterations

The Council confirmed that a site meeting had recently taken place. It was RESOLVED to support the application as the materials to be used were in keeping with properties in the vicinity. The Council was also pleased to note that the applicant was giving consideration to any potential drainage issues by consideration of upgrading/improving the current drainage system

ii. Escot – update re planning application 21/2045/FUL -Devon Country Pursuits Ltd Andrew Wood - EDDC -Director of Place had advised of the following:-

"Planning Officers are currently in discussion with the applicant/agent regarding conditions which have been requested by the Environmental Health Officer during their consideration of the application (relating to noise and hours of operation, as detailed in their consultation comments on the application), along

with other conditions which Planning Officers consider appropriate, if the proposal is to be recommended for approval. The result of these discussions will aid Planning Officers in determining the final recommendation which will be made on the proposal. It is hoped that this matter can be resolved so that the application can be brought to a close during January 2025. Officers are currently waiting for a response from the applicant/agent and this will ultimately determine the timescales moving forward." The Clerk had responded by querying why the expiry date for the planning application was shown on EDDC's website as 2/11/22 as she understood that there were statutory timescales a planning authority had to adhere to, re determining a planning application and it appeared that they had not been met. To date she was waiting a further response from Mr Wood.

iii. Site Meetings – consideration of most suitable days for site meetings to be arranged It was AGREED that there should be more flexibility on the days for site meetings to take place rather than simply having them always on a Saturday as this seemed to preclude a number of councillors from attending. It was also suggested that site meetings could take place prior to a Council meeting.

iv. Any other planning matters

A letter of complaint from Gittisham Parish Council to EDDC had been e-mailed to all councillors regarding the process that had been followed in the Local Plan site selection procedures followed by the Strategic Planning Committee. It was AGREED that the Clerk send a letter of thanks to Gittisham PC as the Council found their letter most informative and hoped they did well with their representations

TO REPORT ANY DELEGATED DECISIONS OF THE COUNCIL (INCLUDING PLANNING)

The following delegated decisions were made i.Prior approval 24/2518/PDQ – Mr and Mrs R Kirby (Class Q) for change of use of 1no. agricultural buildings to 1no. dwellinghouse (Use Class C3) with associated works, including garden area, parking and turning space – Talewater Hill Farm Talewater Talaton Exeter

EX5 2RR

Provided this application met the criteria under class Q of part 3 of the Town and Country Planning Order 2024, Talaton Parish Council supported the application for a sympathetic barn conversion that fits well into the land-scape and provides a home for a family member.

ii. Planning Application 23/2435/FUL – Mr R Hale Proposed removal of a window on the rear elevation Larkbeare House Talaton Exeter EX5 2RZ

Given that the window in question was added in the 1930's to the rear elevation, Talaton Parish Council was happy to support the application

iii. Planning Application 24/2436/LBC Mr R
Hale- Proposed internal room layout changes,
including removal/addition of walls and doors;
removal of a window on the rear elevation Larkbeare House Talaton Exeter EX5 2RZ
Talaton Parish Council is not commenting on
the application for internal works, as it considers that this is best left to the experts in
EDDC's planning team.

TO APPROVE 25/26 PRECEPT AMOUNT

After much discussion it was RESOLVED to approve a precept of £9200 this being an increase of £60 from the previous year's amount. It was noted that this was the lowest increase in four years

VE DAY 8TH MAY 2025

There was much discussion. It was AGREED that a Council organised event would not take place ie a street party as VE Day would not be a public holiday. However representations could be made to the Talaton Inn by the Vice-Chair re the suggestion of a Fish and Chip evening which was being promoted by national organisers as being a traditional meal to have as part of the event. Bunting could also be displayed around the village and contact would be made with the persons who normally provide/erected this.

The Clerk reported that the Trust no longer had any bird cherry trees left which the Council had requested. Alternative species of tree were available but the Council concluded that they would be too large. It was AGREED that that Clerk request a bird cherry tree immediately that the Trust advertised their availability in the future

S106 FUNDING – TO CONSIDER SWW QUOTE FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A WATER PIPE AT THE ALLOTMENTS AND TO MAKE DECISIONS AS APPRO-PRIATE

A quote had been received from SWW but this was simply for the connection charge and did not include digging for the laying of pipes; road closure order and legal costs for easements. It was AGREED that the Clerk request an additional quote which encompassed all the aforementioned costs to allow the Council to make an informed decision about whether or not the installation was affordable

HORTON AND PAYTHERDEN SOLAR FARMS – UPDATE AND TO MAKE DE-CISIONS AS NECESSARY

The Clerk has sent chasing e-mails to the contacts of both proposed solar farms regarding the monies that the Council was entitled to for the benefit of the community. Paytherden had not responded and Horton advised that it would sending out letters to the local community advising of its plans but would also be willing to attend a Council meeting. It was AGREED

that the Clerk request again the information it was seeking from Horton and Paytherden as to the amounts of money both solar farms would provide for the local community


- i. i.Following concern expressed by a parishioner, the Clerk had chased Ed Polding regarding the blocked drain near the telephone box and was waiting a reply. It was reported by the Chair that rainwater downfall was running through the ditch only, which ditch DCC had dug to try and resolve the issue. In addition water was running from Orchard Close and dribbling down the concrete steps that led to the footpath and road. In view of the cold weather, if the water froze this would have serious health and safety implications for the elderly residents of Orchard Close who used the footpath.
- ii. The Ottery St Mary and Fairmile `finger` from the finger post near the Talaton Inn was missing. The Clerk would report this on the DCC system
- iii. iii. The Clerk to contact Ed Polding DCC regarding the mud/stones run off on the highway which had resulted from the recent excessive rainfall and which was creating drain blockages again. Mr Polding be asked to request the farmer responsible, to clear the debris and ditches
- iv. Iv. A large pothole on the Escot Straight (on left as heading for Fairmile) to be reported to DCC
- v. The Vice-Chair would monitor the pothole at Newtown
 Corner. It was considered not deep enough yet to be reported to DCC


