And so the Coronation has gone and a colour centre spread is included here to remember this very special occasion, enjoyed by all, with good weather!





#### The Wildings at Royston Farm


The Wildings is a unique, not for profit, independent Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) school. We have successfully completed our first full OFSTED inspection with a glowing report, but also identifying areas that we need to improve on. We have a significant waiting list of young people desperate to secure a place at our school. The independent SEMH sector of education is dominated by over 95% profit making companies. We are going to show that there is a different way – ethical and child focussed. We are going to change the sector, providing value for money to cash strapped local authorities.

We aim to connect with the young people and their families that enter our community and help to build resilience that will prepare them for a happy and successful life. We are committed to helping young people shift from a pathway of poor functioning to one of recovery and growth.

Our unique educational provision, based in the tranguil and therapeutic setting of Royston Farm, Talewater, focuses on the recovery from trauma and associated SEMH needs of young people and their families that have been failed and compounded by the educational system. With the recovery from adverse childhood experiences as a priority, the school is focussed on the rapeutic recovery and the rapid, resilient and sustainable development of associated in a Social, Emotional and Mental Health aspect. We provide a scaffold for young people to develop positive longterm outcomes. We support families to stabilise and improve through targeted support. Focus on building a balanced emotional profile for each of our young people that enables them to understand themselves better, develop resilience in life and learning, developing engagement in a personalised pathway of education and gaining the skills to become lifelong learners. Whilst there is an academic focus, this is achieved through developing long term positive mental health, the ability to live happy, healthy, and safe lives, maintaining relationships in a positive manner and accessing relevant and sustainable employment. Our young people get to know and understand themselves. We are also supporting young people and their families with Education, Health and Care, where other services cannot or will not support them.

We are currently leasing our site and seeking funding to purchase from the private owners to secure our future. Once purchased, we aim to convert the derelict pig sheds on site to create a beautiful single story wooden school building that will meet the educational, emotional and psychological needs of our young people, eventually expanding to a maximum of 20 young people on this site. Our longer term ambition is to open further sites in the same model across the county and potentially the country and genuinely transform independent SEMH education for the greater good of all.

We would also like to develop our site into a community resource that can be accessed by all members of the local community. Initially, we are attempting to start up a growing space for a community veg box project and have recently been awarded a grant to purchase a poly tunnel to support this.

#### **Jobs for July**

Weed regularly. Remember the old saying, "One year's seeding, seven years weeding."

Water veg such as lettuces and cabbages, to help prevent bolting, or at least delay it.

Net peas, brassicas and soft fruit against birds.

Keep looking out for aphids on your broad beans and rose buds and remove as soon as they arrive. Aphids have girl power and are able to reproduce at an alarming rate if they are given ideal conditions.

Keep feeding tomatoes and peppers and don't forget to keep picking out tomato side shoots, if appropriate.

Dry out garlic, onion and shallot bulbs by gently loosening the soil around the roots eventually lift the bulbs and lay them on the ground to dry. Weather permitting!

Keep dead heading flowers to prolong their flowering period.

Please leave shallow water out for the wild life which share your garden. Then sit back, enjoy the fruits of your labour and think about what to enter in the show. Don't be shy. The more entries we have, the better the show will be.

Show day is Saturday August 5<sup>th</sup>. All paid up members will receive a show schedule through their letter box.

Entry forms must be placed in the box in Talaton Community Shop by 6pm on Wednesday  $2^{nd}$  August.

Remember it is free to enter. Help to make this year's show the best yet by entering as many exhibits as you can.



#### **Talaton Parish Council Report**

# PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION (INCLUDING PARISH ASSETS) AND UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED

A list of parish assets requiring attention had been e-mailed to all councillors. The Chairman would ascertain from her contacts whether they were available to carry out the maintenance work to the seats and the sign board. The cleaning / maintenance of the phone box would be dealt with once a use for the box had been decided. Four potholes on the Fairmile road had been reported to DCC but only one had been repaired. The other three were not yet at the stage for the repairs to be carried out, according to DCC. Councillors were appalled at DCC's decision not to carry out repairs to the three potholes, as they considered them to be highly dangerous. They also disputed that the fourth pothole had been repaired. It was **AGREED** to review these matters at next month's meeting. A number of signs erected by SWW/Contractors in respect of the recent water main scheme had still not been collected. The Clerk to ask SWW to arrange for their removal. Verges at Bittery Cross needed trimming. The top and bottom concrete steps in front of 'Bankside' were crumbling. This was a health and safety issue and required urgent attention. The white lines at Bittery Cross (where a serious vehicle accident had occurred) had still not been repainted despite the Clerk reporting this issue some time ago and sending reminders and the finger name sign had still not been repointed in the correct direction. The Clerk would chase all these matters up with DCC. The Chairman would speak to the parishioner regarding his/her trimming of an adopted highway verge in the Parish. The Council already paid a contractor to carry out this work and also there were likely insurance implications if the parishioner continued to carry out this work. It was noted that Cllr Peters and Roy Adams had voluntarily dealt with the fence at the allotments and had repaired/replaced the fence posts at no cost to the Council. They were warmly thanked for all their hard work. The Council very much appreciated their efforts.





#### HALL DETAILS

The Village Hall is ideal for all manner of occasions, including meetings, luncheon and dinner events, wedding parties, children's parties, fairs and concerts and exercise classes.

The main Hall is approximately 12.7m x 6.3m and can seat up to 100 people in theatre-style layout and up to 80 for dinners or lunches dependent on layout. Our licence also allows for up to 145 at standing only events.

There is a separate committee room measuring approximately 6.3m x 2.3m which can be hired on its own for small meetings etc.

The Hall benefits from a fully equipped kitchen with serving area, toilet facilities and a foyer. In addition, there are ample tables and chairs, a stage, and a lighting system for stage events.

Free WiFi is available.


#### STAGE

There is a stage with curtains, moveable stage steps, small room at the back for changing and toilet facilities.

#### KITCHEN

The well-equipped kitchen contains work surfaces for food prepping, an oven and hob, a microwave, electric water heater and 2 fridges.

There is enough crockery, glasses, and cutlery to cater for over 100 people.



#### TALATON PARISH HALL HIRE CHARGES

Main Hall £10 per hour Committee Room £5 per hour

Minimum hiring period is 2 hours and this includes setting up and clearing away. There is no additional charge for use of the kitchen or stage. A deposit is not required but the hirer will be expected to pay for breakages or any repairs required resulting from damage during the hiring period.

Discounted rates are available for regular users.

The rate for professional events is £20 per hour. For such events all tables and chairs will be set up as required and cleared away at the end of the event. The bar can be made available subject to negotiation.

#### Following are available for hire by Talaton residents for use away from hall:-

Cutlery & China - £10 Wine Glasses - £5 per box of 24
Tables - £1 each Padded Chairs - 50p each (internal)

Plastic Chairs – 25p each.

Gazebos 3mx3m - £10 ea (10 avail) Gazebos 6mx3m - £75 ea (2 avail)

All the above are per day.

In addition to the hiring fee a deposit is required for gazebo hire which will be returned if the items are returned in the same condition as that at the start of the hire period. The deposit for the 6mx3m gazebos is £100 and the 3mx3m gazebos is £50. Cutlery, China, cutlery and glasses must be washed prior to return.



#### Rainfall at the Cobblers/Parish Hall 100 Club

#### Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During May

The first few days of May were settled but it soon became quite wet between the period of 4<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup>. And after that, till the end of the month we only had 1.5 mms!

The Met office tells us that the mean average temperatures were 'somewhat' above average, but that they were below average at night-time. May was the 7<sup>th</sup> warmest month since 1884. Rainfall in the Southwest was only 55% of what was normal.

A maximum temperature of 25.1C was recorded at Porthmadog in Wales on the  $30^{th}$  and the lowest of -2.2C at Glascarnock in Scotland on the  $2^{nd}$ . On the  $10^{th}$  43.6 mms or 1.7 inches of rain fell at the Harestock sewage works in Hampshire.

Here in Talaton we had 8 days only when rain fell and 22 days when we never had a drop!

Our total for the year now stands at 15.0 inches.
