Rainfall at the Cobblers & Parish Hall 100 Club

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During May

May started with thunderstorms in most parts of southern England, and I measured 40ms or just over $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches on the very first day of the month. The 2^{nd} week was more settled, however and the last 2 weeks were wet with 48ms or nearly 2 inches falling during the week starting 21^{st} .

According to the Met Office the UK experienced its warmest May since records began in 1884.

Rainfall over the most of the UK was above average with some places seeing over 1/3 more than average.

Here in Talaton I recorded 146ms or 3.8 inches, last year we only had 64ms or just over 2inches.

This May we had 146 or 3.8 inches, there were 20 days with no rain and our yearly total now stands at 25.8 inches

Jobs for July

Weed regularly. Remember the old saying, "One year's seeding, seven years weeding."

Water veg such as lettuces and cabbages to help prevent bolting or at least delay it. Net peas, brassicas and soft fruit against birds.

Pinch out the tops of climbing beans when they reach the tops of their supports so that they don't grow too long and become tangled and top heavy.

Feed tomatoes and peppers and don't forget to keep picking out tomato side shoots unless you have tomatoes like Tumbling Tom. Dry out garlic, onions and shallots by gently loosening the soil around the roots eventually lift the bulbs and lay them on the ground to dry. Weather permitting!

Keep dead heading flowers to prolong their flowering period. Then sit back enjoy the fruits of your labour and think about what to enter in the show. Don't forget it is on 3rd August. Remember it is free to enter and don't forget the new class, all you photographers. Help to make this year's show the best yet by entering as many exhibits as you can.




ROBOTS Red Coat Tour of the Quay in Exeter

6 June 2024 D Day 80 years on

The 80th Anniversary of the invasion of France to liberate Europe and secure all the freedoms we enjoy today, freedom of choice e.g. to choose our Government.

I had the privelege of attending the 65th and the 78th Anniversaries in France the former at Arromanche and the latter at Juno. The amount of historic military support was amazing over there and there was much over here as well. This is a glimpse of all these I have been to, in deep reverence and respect. I trust that none will mind me doing this, but I feel strongly this should NEVER be forgotten.



At Upottery this year there was a wonderful para drop from two C 47s (Dakotas to those of a certain age!) by around 30 military parachutists onto the airfield, in beautiful weather unlike the actual day, but like it in its cold temperature.



Old Jeeps and lorries in 2009 so much that the beach at Arromanche seemed full.



At 12.00 am 6 June 2022 in front of the Café Gondre, we walked over Pegasus Bridge in a large crowd with pipes and drums towards the Memorial beside the bridge, where 78 years earlier The Paras landed in gliders and held the Bridge plus the second one over the Orne River. The original bridge is in the museum beside here and can be walked over, showing its battle damage.







Talaton Parish Council Report

The following are major items from the minutes but a full copy of the minutes may be viewed on both Parish Noticeboards and on the Parish Web site www.talatonparishcouncil.co.uk

INFORMATION FROM THE MEETING OF 5TH JUNE 2024 TO CONSIDER PLANNING APPLICATION 24/1029/AGR APPLICANT: MR & MRS TUCKER PROPOSAL: PROPOSED AGRICULTURAL BARN LOCATION: SEWAGE WORKS TALATON

The Council **RESOLVED** to support the application as it considered the proposed barn to be an improvement, sustainable and in keeping with other agricultural buildings. *Proposed by Cllr Walker and seconded by the Chair*

VILLAGE GREEN (THE MOOR) UPDATE RE VONEUS BROADBAND The Clerk provided an update regarding the Council's insurers and the referral to DAS UK Group. When she had further information she would report back.

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND UP-DATE ON ITEMS REPORTED AND TO AGREE ANY FINANCIAL PROVI-SION (IF APPLICABLE)

- i. A Parishioner had sent the Clerk a video of the deluge of water coming off the fields near Talaton Barns. The video had been forwarded to councillors and Kyle at DCC. It was understood that maize had recently been planted in the field concerned which it was believed would not alleviate the flooding problem. There was also a nearby culvert which the Vice-Chair's husband had recently cleared, but the culvert would not stop the sheer force of the water coming off the field and onto the highway. There was still debris remaining on the road surface. The Clerk would liaise further with Kyle about these matters. However the Council was already aware that he had arranged a meeting with the land agent/tenant farmer in an attempt to rectify some of the issues. The Council appreciated all his efforts in trying to deal with the many issues.
- ii. Most of the potholes along the Escot straight had been filled, but there were still some that needed attention.
- iii. The Clerk had re-reported the water issue on the road opposite the Parish Hall to Kyle. He was of the view that despite SWW denying responsibility it was likely that the leak was coming from SWW apparatus. He further advised that he would continue to monitor the situation, however with limited funding DCC was unlikely to carry out work at this location as funding had to be prioritised. It was understood that SWW contractors had been seen in the vicinity recently
- iv. IV. The pothole opposite the phone box had been filled
- v. V.Potholes have been reported to DCC (at Beacon Cross to Talaton Farm Cross) which DCC has confirmed is on their 'to do' list





- vi. The Clerk had reported to Kyle the damaged tree on the highway by the Escot straight where all the pot hole problems have been Kyle had been advised of the raised footpath between the steps at Orchard Close towards Beech House, next to the pub. The Council has raised this issue before but this time had emphasised the safety risk that it posed to the elderly residents of the bungalows at Orchard Close and the adjacent property Bankside, many of whom are disabled or with limited mobility. Since the footpath was dug up for infrastructure some years ago, it slopes down towards the road, making it difficult and frightening for these residents to use, exposing them to the risk of a fall onto the road 3-4 feet below.
- vii. A sign had appeared at the gated entrance to Talaton House advising of a road closure in Sep 2023! The Chair and Cllr Walker had reversed the sign and requested it be collected. The matter was in hand
- viii. A damaged chevron safety sign was lying on the verge of the railway <u>bridge</u> (as you leave <u>Talaton heading to Fairmile</u>). This needed to be re-sited in the correct position urgently and had already been reported to Kyle
- ix. The white line at Bittery Cross had not been reinstated (crash site). However the Clerk had referred this to Kyle's predecessor some months ago and he was of the view this was low priority. The Clerk would again raise the issue with Kyle.
- x. The 'Slow' road markings at Hillside and at the top of Beacon Hill had worn away. The Clerk to request of DCC if they could be re-painted.
- xi. The Clerk to write to all Hillside residents requesting that the driver of the large lorry parked on the highway at weekends, be parked on the carpark available at Hillside. The parking of the vehicle on the section of narrow highway was clearly a h&s issue causing potential problems for all vehicles travelling along that section road if it was to remain in situ
- xii. A dangerous pothole had been located between Beacon Cross and New Barn Lane which the Clerk will report to DCC
- xiii. The ornaments on the grass verge at Newtown were causing further concern. The Clerk advised that this had been considered previously by DCC who in response had advised that the verge was not maintainable highway and therefore it could not do anything about the problem. Cllr Walker agreed to take some photographs which she would e-mail to the Clerk and the Clerk would contact DCC again
- xiv. Two small oak tree plants were growing out of the of the railway bridge (as you leave Talaton heading to Fairmile). The Clerk to contact Network Rail to deal with the matter

The Council's comments relayed to EDDC and which were endorsed at the meeting were:- `The Parish Council strongly supports the application as the work to the

building allows it to breathe thus eliminating damp that had built up from the previous renovation due to incorrect materials having been used. The work also ensures that Stoney Court maintains its historical significance and is fully in keeping with the architecture`.

I.TELEPHONE BOX – TO CONSIDER FURTHER THE POSSESSORY TI-TLE APPLICATION AND THE HISTORY OF GRASS CUTTING

The Clerk had checked old Minutes, invoices and had made contact with the former clerk and current grass cutting contractors to establish if there was any clear evidence that the Council over the past twelve years had either instructed parishioners/contractors to cut the grass and that the area on which the telephone box and bench were sited, had been under the Council's sole control for the past 12 years. The Clerk had prepared a schedule of the information she had obtained which had been e-mailed to councillors. The Council **AGREED** that the evidence was insufficient and would not satisfy a possessory title application made to the Land Registry. Therefore the decision of the Council at its April 2024 meeting (to start the twelve year time line from that date (as its contractor would be responsible for the grass cutting of the area)) was reaffirmed

CO-OPTION UPDATE

The vacancy had now been advertised as the date for 10 electors to request a poll had passed with no such request having been made. The Clerk at the meeting passed application packs to the Chair which she could make available to interested parties. The position had also been advertised on the website (where application forms could be downloaded), noticeboards, Talaton Talk and would shortly be advertised in the Calendar. The closing date for applications was 30th June as it was hoped a new councillor could be co-opted at the July meeting. However the date could be extended.

HORTON SOLAR FARM COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND- UPDATE

Chloe Hood – Head of Communications & Engagement at Aura Power had advised that it was anticipated that Talaton would be a beneficiary of the community benefit fund, as a proportion of the development was within Talaton Parish. Aura were yet to firm up the administration details, however typically this would be administered by the majority host parish council which was Whimple. Chloe would be in touch again in due course following discussions with Whimple Parish Council. The information was noted by the Council. Cllr Bos also mentioned another solar farm which may benefit the parish financially (Paytherden Solar Farm) and this information was also noted.
