

Jobs for July

Weed regularly. Remember the old saying, "One year's seeding, seven years weeding."

Water veg such as lettuces and cabbages to help prevent bolting or at least delay it.

Pinch out the tops of climbing beans when they reach the tops of their supports so that they don't grow too long and become tangled and top heavy.

Feed tomatoes and peppers and don't forget to keep picking out tomato side shoots, except on the bush varieties.

Dry out garlic, onions and shallots by gently loosening the soil around the roots eventually lift the bulbs and lay them on the ground to dry. Weather permitting!

Keep dead heading flowers to prolong their flowering period.

Then sit back and think about what to enter in the show.

But before that, two important things you might need to do.

Firstly please return any trophies you or your children won last year by 14th July to Pam W or leave in the shop with your name.

Secondly check that you have renewed your membership your last chance to do so is now or at least before 7th July. Adults are only able to enter exhibits in the show if they are paid up members of the Club.





INFORMATION FROM THE MEETINGS OF 14TH MAY & 14TH JUNE

ELECTION OF CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR FOR 25/26

There was one nomination for the Chair – Cllr Lenehan. There was a majority vote and it was **RESOLVED** to elect Cllr Lenehan as Chair . There was one nomination for the Vice-Chair– Cllr Hawkins. There was a majority vote for Cllr Hawkins and it was **RE-SOLVED** to elect Cllr Hawkins as Vice-Chair

DCC CLLR CATHY CONNOR

DCC Cathy Connor introduced herself and explained her intentions during her term of office. She explained that she had 23 parishes in her area and she hoped to get to as many Talaton council meetings as she was practicably able to do so. Her first DCC meeting was on 22nd May. She then left to attend the Payhembury PC meeting.

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND AN UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED AND TO AGREE ANY FINANCIAL PROVISION (IF APPLICABLE)

EDDC Matters

- *i.* Hillside The Clerk asked for an update from EDDC re Hillside property. On 30th May Sharon Buscombe EDDC's Estate Manager advised:-`*The property is currently with our voids team. The repairs and garden clearance will then be undertaken and once this process is completed the property will then be relet to a new incoming tenant'.*
- ii. The Clerk noted that the abandoned blue car parked in the Hillside car park now had a notice on it asking the owner to get in touch with EDDC about the car. It also stated that if the owner failed to do this within 14 days of the notice, then it would be removed. However the notice didn't have a date on it!

DCC Highways Updates:

Potholes

- i. Rosemary Lane- DCC's contractor would further investigate and/or effect a repair
- ii. Road near entrance to Ivy Cottages The pothole had been repaired
- iii. Road from Talaton Cross to Beacon Cross - DCC's contractor would further investigate and/or effect a repair
- iv. Road from Talaton Farm Cross to Fairmile Inn, Fairmile – DCC was unable to locate the problem

Other DCC Matters

- i. Weeds growing in the base of the raised footpath near the Talaton Inn had been removed
- ii. A road closure sign had now been removed from the end of Orchard Hill
- iii. The chevron sign near the railway bridge (on the side as you drive into Talaton) needed to be reported to DCC again. The Clerk thought it had been securely tied to the other chevron sign but Cllr Walker advised that that was not the case.
- iv. The Clerk couldn't locate the skid signs by Ivy Cottage which required

removal (the matter was raised at the May PC meeting). The Vice-Chair confirmed that they had been removed

- v. ED Polding DCC Highway's Officer advised re trench near phone box:-Devon County Council won't be able to fund the installation of a new pipe here. As you can see from the picture below from 2009 google street view, the trench was an existing feature that got buried over time and is necessary for the road drainage to function properly. The limited funds we have are to maintain or repair existing assets. This verge is not part of a footpath or public right of way so I'm a little confused why anyone would choose to walk through or near to the trench. It was AGREED that the Council would review the matter in August/September after SWW had carried out repairs to a water cover nearby which may/may not have improved the situation
- vi. At the end of Blackpit Lane (near Rydon Farm) the road surface had worn away
- vii. The white lines at Bittery Cross required repainting urgently. The matter had been reported on previous occasions by the Clerk but DCC had still not dealt with the issue
- viii.Ed Polding had collected a 30mph road sign from Cllr Hirt some time ago
- ix. Cllr Peters mentioned that a resident had contacted him about a letter he had received from DCC advising he needed to carry out clearance of a ditch. Cllr Peters questioned why DCC was no longer carrying out this work. The Clerk explained that due to reduced budgets DCC could no longer carry this work out as a favour to landowners (as it had done so in the past) and it was now the landowners responsibility to deal with it.

Other Maintenance Matters

- i. Network Rail advised with regards to the small oak tree growing out the railway bridge:- 'Our structural engineers would like to thank you for raising your concerns. At present there is no immediate work required but on next examination, if any actions are required this will be arranged'. It was noted that ivy and some small saplings were growing on the other railway bridge in the Parish. The Clerk to report this to Network Rail
- ii. The hedge by Orchard Close bungalows was becoming so overgrown that persons with mobility aids, pushchairs etc were struggling to walk on the pavement
- iii. Outside the property 'Bankside' the stopcock had sunk which would result in issues if it needed to be turned off
- iv. It was noted that the decorator had carried out an excellent paint job to the telephone kiosk. However there were substantial quantities of undercoat and gloss paint left over. It was **AGREED** that the Clerk would advertise the paint on the Community Clerks website and DALC to see if she could sell it on.

VILLAGE GREEN (THE MOOR) – UPDATE RE VONEUS BROADBAND WAYLEAVE AGREEMENT

A wayleave agreement had now been received from the Council's solicitors which had been e-mailed to all councillors for consideration. After some discussion it was **RESOLVED** that the Council enter into the agreement with Voneus.

THE COUNCIL'S INSURER'S RE-QUIREMENTS RE THE INSTALLA-TION OF A ROPE SWING AND TO MAKE DECISIONS (AS REQUIRED)

The Council's insurers had advised that the provision of a rope swing would require the equipment to be of industry standard & signed off in the same way as playground equipment with regular inspec-A risk assessment would be retions. quired and the swing would need to installed to relevant h&s provisions plus there would be ongoing maintenance. Additional insurance playground liability would be needed which would incur additional premium costs. There was much discussion by the Council who RE-**SOLVED** that because of the potential health and safety risks and insurers requirements; reluctantly they were of the view, not to progress the installation of the swing

UPDATE ON MANDATORY RE-QUIREMENTS RE A GENERIC EMAIL ACCOUNT HOSTED ON AN AUTHORITY OWNED DOMAIN It was AGREED that the Clerk should obtain quotes for a generic email account hosted on an authority owned domain, as DALC had advised it was now a mandatory requirement as per the 2025 Practitioner's Guide. This change would apply to the 2025/26 Annual Governance and Accountability Return where it would form part of the new Assertion 10 in the Council's Annual Governance Statement

PLANNING MATTERS (IF ANY) A new planning application had arrived after the agenda had been published. 25/0951/LBC - Mr R Hale, Larkbeare <u>House – Re-slate both main gable roofs;</u> raise lead flat roof and replace existing rooflight with a smaller rooflight to allow for raising the flat roof

The Clerk had spoken to the applicant regarding a site visit. However the applicant was of the view that as this was a listed building consent application (and that he was replacing the roof with the same materials) that there wasn't anything additional he could show councillors to that which was already on EDDC's planning website. After some discussion it was **AGREED** that a site visit was unnecessary and it was **RESOLVED** that the Council should submit the following comment to EDDC;- `*The Council is happy* with the proposed works subject to listed building consent being granted`

TO REPORT ANY DELEGATED DE-CISIONS OF THE COUNCIL (INCLUDING PLANNING)

25/0962/PDR Mr O Boles - Rydon Farm, Talaton, Exeter EX5 2RP Change of use of agricultural building to joinery workshop and associated workshop storage (no retail use) The delegated decision was:

'Talaton Parish Council supports the application for change of use. Currently the building is used for storage, and the changes to allow use as a workshop are sympathetic to the structure. The work includes sound mitigation which will reduce any impact on neighbours'. The decision was noted

<u>LESSONS IN CHEMISTRY</u> <u>CHOSEN AS FAVOURITE BOOK BY DEVON READERS</u>

The Libraries Unlimited Book Awards announces winner

Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus has been crowned the winner in the inaugural Libraries Unlimited Book Awards.

The awards, organised by the charity that runs libraries in the county, launched last November with a shortlist of twenty of the most borrowed titles from Devon and Torbay's libraries. Library users then cast their votes, with polling stations in the libraries and an online voting system.

Bonnie Garmus' Lessons in Chemistry took the top spot. The novel which deals with chemistry, cookery and feminism in the 1950s, well and truly passed the litmus test with Devon's readers.

On receiving the award Bonnie said: "I'm very honoured to receive the inaugural Libraries Unlimited Book Award!
