





Planning Meeting 11th May 2022


To consider Planning Application - 22/0905/FUL - Hill Mount Road from Bittery Cross to Talewater Cross - Erection of replacement barn for domestic use- following a site visit and consideration a vote was taken with Cllrs voting to support the application. Proposed by Cllr Walker, seconded by Cllr Lenehan, all in favour. The following comment to be submitted to EDDC ... The PC fully support the application. The new building will be a vast improvement on the existing building.

Planning Meeting 18th May 2022

To consider Planning Application - 22/0783/MFUL - Land East of Rutton Farm Rull Lane Whimple-Construction and operation of a ground mounted solar farm, with permission being required for 40 years, comprising solar arrays, equipment housing, sub-station, fencing, ancillary equipment, landscaping and associated development – after consideration a vote was taken (Cllr Bos did not vote due to personal interest) with all Cllrs objecting to the application due to concerns over access and impact on traffic, loss of agricultural land for food production, the size of the development and impact on the countryside, the Governments policy on not using greenfield sites for solar farms and the benefits of the proposal were not clear. Objection proposed by Cllr Lenehan, seconded by Cllr Walker. The Cllrs thanked the representative from Aura Power and said that she had made a very good presentation. The PC were in favour of renewable energy but in the right location. Cllr Gray to draw up the response to be sent to EDDC.

Meeting held on 1st June 2022

To review Statutory Documents – it was proposed that the old Code of Conduct be replaced with the new EDDC Members Code of Conduct. Proposed for adoption by Cllr Walker, seconded by Cllr Bos, all in favour. The Financial Regulations, Standing Orders, Risk Assessment, Complaints Procedure and the Protocol for filming and recording meetings were all proposed for re adoption by Cllr Walker, seconded by Cllr Bos, all in favour



To discuss plans for the Archive for Talaton Kindertransport – the Archive will be a project for 2023/24 when funds will be made available from the budget.

Parish Maintenance- items requiring attention and update on items reported to include the raised footpath near Orchard Close- Clerk awaiting a response from Phil Morgan re the raised footpath which has still not been repaired.

Quote to be obtained from A. Hazeldine for spraying the area between the steps by Orchard Close and Talaton Inn.

Pothole – between Woodmans Orchard and Talaton Cross

Potholes— on the edge of highway opposite Larkbeare Cross at the passing place.

Items for information only or discussion on the next agenda - APM-

The Wildings School to be invited to give a report next year, ways to encourage more residents to attend were also discussed this included allocating a maximum time of 3 minutes for each report and providing savouries and snacks along with the refreshments; the defibs have been checked, the online reporting system still not working but the defibs are listed on the national site

Jobs for July

Weed regularly. Remember the old saying, "One year's seeding, seven years weeding." Water veg such as lettuces and cabbages to help prevent bolting or at least delay it.

Net peas, brassicas and soft fruit against birds.

Pinch out the tops of climbing beans when they reach the tops of their supports so that they don't grow too long and become tangled and top heavy.

Feed tomatoes and peppers and don't forget to keep picking out tomato side shoots.

Dry out garlic, onions and shallots by gently loosening the soil around the roots eventually lift the bulbs and lay them on the ground to dry. Weather permitting!

Keep dead heading flowers to prolong their flowering period.

Leave shallow water out for the wildlife which share your garden. Then sit back enjoy the fruits of your labour and think about what to enter in the show. Don't forget it is on Saturday 6th August. Remember it is free to enter. Help to make this year's show the best yet by entering as many exhibits as you can. Refreshments and raffle will be back as will the presentation of the cups.

Supporting Devon's Early Stage Creative Artists

New FREE 4 week course to help Creatives build their business

The Business and Intellectual Property Centre in Devon (BIPC) has worked with experienced artists and experts to create a new FREE course designed to help early stage creatives to develop their business

The 4 week Art of Business course starts on Monday 4th July and can be accessed both online and in person. Local Artists will be sharing their knowledge and experience, through interactive sessions at Exeter and Barnstaple Libraries, and online.

The Art of Business Course will incorporate business skills for those working with:

- Written Word
- Photography
- Film-Making
- Music
- Painting & Sculpture

The programme aims to develop the business skills to support an artist in creating a career from their creativity. Our skills-based workshops include marketing, branding, social media training, and web design. Alongside the events and workshops, there will be networking events for creatives to meet other like-minded individuals.

BIPC Devon Manager Richard Love said: We have some great Colleges in Devon, with many excellent courses for art students, as well as thriving arts and creative communities all over Devon. We wanted to work with colleges to reach early-stage creatives as well as those looking for a career change. We have worked with local successful artists and experts, to create a programme covering key

business skills and gives attendees a flavour of what it is really like to make a living as an artist, and what that entails.

BIPC Devon's ART of Business Course runs throughout July and features weekly webinars and online workshops, interactive sessions, networking opportunities and 1-1 support. Attendees will grow their business skills and learn how to find their niche, build an audience, grow a career as an artist, and find inspiration from the creatives delivering the course. The material will be recorded so participants can review it at their own pace. There will also be opportunities to join up with existing creative communities for networking sessions.



About Young Community Theatre 4All

Following the highly successful Community Theatre 4All production of "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" in March 2020 when a cast of 30 adults were joined by 20 children it was obvious that we needed to open a group for younger members. After a long pause, caused by Covid, the children's group was formed in October 2021 and gave their first performance of an original piece based upon the children's book "Where the Wild Things Are" by Maurice Sendak.

Next year the group will be working on a major piece of children's musical theatre called "Rats!" – an up-beat retelling of the story of "The Pied Piper of Hamlyn". Rehearsals for this show will begin in October.

For children who wish to be involved in "Rats!" this is the time to join the group, to come and make friends and discover what working with Frances and me is like. In the months of May, June and July the group will meet in Talaton Parish Hall from 4.30 to 5.30 on the first Tuesday of the month. Each of these summer sessions will be independent of the others, so if your son/daughter is unable to attend one of the sessions that is not a problem. There will be no meetings in August or September and from October the group will meet every Tuesday in Talaton Parish Hall, initially from 4.30 to 5.30 but then as rehearsals develop the group will go on to 6.00pm. There will be no charge for the Summer Term 'Taster Sessions' but in the Autumn and Spring terms there will be a charge of £25 per term to cover hall hire fees and contribute towards the production expenses.

Young Community Theatre 4All is lead by Tom and Frances Samson, both experienced retired teachers. Tom was a Drama and Theatre teacher and both Tom and Frances have enhanced DBS clearance.

For this project the group will be joined by Julia Green. Julia is well known and respected for her musical work in Whimple, the surrounding villages and in Exeter.

30th Anniversary Events



Rainfall at the Cobblers & Parish Hall 100 Club

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton during May

Most of May was quiet and rather unsettled and showery for much of the time. Temperatures were mostly above average in the UK, and some parts of England and Wales were slightly drier than expected.

May however according to the Met Office was the 5th Warmest May according to records going back to 1884.

The mean temperature in the UK was 11.8C up by 1.2C. The rainfall in England and Wales was near or rather below the average. A maximum temperature of 27.50C was recorded at Heathrow on the 17th, and a minimum of -1.7C was Recorded at Atanaharra in Sutherland in Scotland on 7th. In 24 hours 65.40m or 2.61 inches of rain fell at Honister in Cumbria on the 10th.

Here in Talaton we had 56m or 2,24 inches of rain; there were 15 days with no rain and our total now stands at 9.15 inches for the year.






