

Jobs for June

Water, Weed, Mulch!
Feed tomato plants when the first fruit sets and pinch out their side shoots. If you leave these shoots then energy will be divert-

ed into them rather than your crop of fruits. Of course there are always exceptions to any rule – don't pinch out side shoots from your free Otter Tumbler tom. Tumblers work better as bush shaped plants.

Mid summer's day should be the time to stop cutting asparagus, give it some well deserved food and let the shoots grow and flourish until they go brown in the late autumn. This will give them a chance to make food for themselves and hopefully give you a good crop next year. Home grown asparagus is well worth trying.

If you haven't already done so, build supports for climbing beans and.... keep sowing quick growing salad crops. They are delicious fresh from the garden. Don't forget to tend some of your crops and flowers ready for our Annual Show on 5th August. You don't have to be an expert. The more entries we receive, the better the show will be.



ROBOTs Roam the Moor

Well, the second attempt by the Retired Old Boys of Talaton to circumnavigate Dartmoor finally arrived in mid -May. The first attempt was postponed because of bad weather and, yes, to be honest this second attempt initially looked doubtful with grey skies and a very average forecast. But, lo and behold out came the sun and it was a wonderful journey over Dartmoor via Moretonhamptstead, Postbridge and finally Princetown. Even HMP Dartmoor looked welcoming. Maybe not.



Time to come clean – not really a circumnavigation of the Moor but rather a wonderful 6.5 miles on the remnants of the old Yelverton to Princetown rail track. Blue skies, marvellous sunshine and views over the Moor that are rarely available. Leaving Princetown, we left the looped track to cut down behind Swell Tor and Kings Tor to reconnect with the track followed the edge of the Swell Tor quarry. Huge history here, and in neighbouring quarries, with the production of masses of high-grade granite from which London Bridge, Nelson's Column, Exeter pavements ...

on and on, were made. An ideal lunch stop, again in brilliant sunshine, on beautifully carved corbels, intended for London Bridge but never used.

Onwards to arrive at Foggintor Quarry where the huge rock

faces showed all the signs of wear whilst the old workings now were hidden under a wonderful lake. It was here that Phil felt he ought to check whether adequate




Health and Safety provision had been made and, rolling on the ground, said "what would you do if I had a coronary here in this remote spot?". He was not impressed with the universal reply "push you over the edge into the lake and carry on with the walk".

The day was rounded off with a pint and food in the historic Warren House Inn, sitting in sunshine looking out over the moor towards Grimspound and Hameldown Tor.

LOCAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS – 4TH MAY 2023

Congratulations to the new East Devon District Councillor for the Tale Vale Ward - Richard Jefferies. His contact details are Richard.jefferies@eastdevon.gov.uk.

The Parish Council Election was uncontested and therefore there is no change on the Parish Council. Cllr Lenehan has been elected as the Chair of the Council and Cllr Hawkins has been elected Vice-Chair

THE CORONATION CELEBRATIONS 7TH MAY 2023

Cllr Lenehan advised that the Coronation event had been a resounding success and was much enjoyed by the community. Financially the Council had broken even with the costs of staging the event and the income received, therefore none of the budget set aside by the Council had been used. Specific persons who had played integral roles in the event had given their services free of charge and had suggested that instead of them receiving payment, that donations be made by the Council to their chosen charities, which the Council agreed to do

PLANNING MATTERS TO CONSIDER AND AGREE (IF APPROPRIATE) COURSES OF ACTION IN RELATION TO THE FOLLOWING:-

i.22/0783/MFUL -Solar Farm Development, Land East of Rutton Farm, Whimple The Council's previous comments relating to the proposed development still stood. However if the development was to go ahead then the Council would make representations to EDDC regarding the screening of the proposed development to minimise the visual impact

ii.Appeal decisions in respect of Planning applications 22/0738/FUL and 22/0739/ LBC – Conversions of roof space to habitable use to include a side dormer and alterations to fenestration - Meadowbrook, Talewater. Talaton EX5 2RS
The appeal details had been noted by the Council

TO RESOLVE THAT THE COUNCIL MEETS THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF THE *GENERAL POWER OF COMPETENCE

It was **RESOLVED** that the Council now met the criteria for eligibility set out in the Localism Act 2011 S8 and the Parish Councils (General Power of Competence (Prescribed Conditions) Order 2012, (namely that at the time the resolution was passed that at least two thirds of the Council held office as a result of being declared elected and that the Parish Clerk held a recognised professional



qualification)

*The General Power of Competence is a 'power of first resort' introduced in the Localism Act 2011. The power allows a local authority such as Talaton Parish Council 'to do anything that individuals of full age can legally do' provided they act within the law and within the general principle of reasonableness.

ALLOTMENTS UPDATE AND ANY ACTIONS TO BE AGREED

The land owners were kindly prepared to offer the Council a further seven year lease of the allotment land for the same rental as currently being paid by the Council. The water provision was being considered and an update would be provided at the next Council meeting in order to progress the matter

LAND REGISTRY UPDATE AND ANY ASSOCIATED MATTERS.

The Council was now registered for Land Registry services which should assist the Council, in relation to any land queries raised by parishioners/councillors.

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED

The Clerk advised that despite reporting 11 potholes to DCC only 4 were deemed worthy of repair by DCC. The potholes at Fairmile appeared to be in a serious state of repair. The Clerk would log these onto DCC's system

ITEMS FOR INFORMATION ONLY OR DISCUSSION ON THE NEXT AGENDA:



HALL DETAILS

The Village Hall is ideal for all manner of occasions, including meetings, luncheon and dinner events, wedding parties, children's parties, fairs and concerts and exercise classes.

The main Hall is approximately 12.7m x 6.3m and can seat up to 100 people in theatre-style layout and up to 80 for dinners or lunches dependent on layout. Our licence also allows for up to 145 at standing only events.

There is a separate committee room measuring approximately 6.3m x 2.3m which can be hired on its own for small meetings etc.

The Hall benefits from a fully equipped kitchen with serving area, toilet facilities and a foyer. In addition, there are ample tables and chairs, a stage, and a lighting system for stage events.

Free WiFi is available.

STAGE

There is a stage with curtains, moveable stage steps, small room at the back for changing and toilet facilities.

KITCHEN

The well-equipped kitchen contains work surfaces for food prepping, an oven and hob, a microwave, electric water heater and 2 fridges.

There is enough crockery, glasses, and cutlery to cater for over 100 people.



TALATON PARISH HALL HIRE CHARGES

Main Hall £10 per hour Committee Room £5 per hour

Minimum hiring period is 2 hours and this includes setting up and clearing away. There is no additional charge for use of the kitchen or stage. A deposit is not required but the hirer will be expected to pay for breakages or any repairs required resulting from damage during the hiring period.

Discounted rates are available for regular users.

The rate for professional events is £20 per hour. For such events all tables and chairs will be set up as required and cleared away at the end of the event. The bar can be made available subject to negotiation.



Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During April

April was an unsettled month with not much consistent warmth; the mean temperature better round the middle of the month and even better in Scotland, Northern Ireland was warmer than the average and England was a little below average.

Rainfall over the whole of the UK was close to average but Kent, of all places was considerably wetter than usual. A minimum temperature of -7.4Cwas recorded twice in Scotland on the 17th and 25th. In 24 hours 54.6mm or 2.1 inches of rain fell at Seathwaite in Cumbria.

Here in Talaton we had 14 days when rain fell and 16 days when it did not. Our total rainfall for the month was 81.3mm or 3.21,inches (which is high for us) and gives us the yearly total 12.45 inches.






