

### **Talaton Parish Council Report**

### Meeting 2nd February 2022

**Public Fifteen-minute open Forum-** members of the public were present to put forward their objections to the amended plans for the planning application at Escot Park. The applicant outlined the positive contribution DCP makes to the local economy and explained the steps they had taken to reduce noise levels.

Residents reiterated their objection to the intrusive noise levels they were exposed to for long periods every day. They also expressed their concerns about the positioning of the test equipment used in the noise survey. It was located close to Talaton Farm Barns which doesn't consider the residential areas of Lashbrook or Bittery Cross, who seem to be more affected by the noise since the clay pigeon shoot was moved away from the vicinity of Talaton Farm Barns.

To consider Planning Application 22/0033/FUL-Weeks Farm, Talaton – Proposed veranda to front elevation of property- after a site visit and discussion a vote was taken to support the application proposed by Cllr Lenehan; seconded by Cllr Gray, all in favour. The following comment to be submitted to EDDC - The PC fully support this application. The added amenity will enhance the building and the new drainage will protect the property.

**To consider Planning Application 21/3144/FUL – The Medlar Tree, Talaton-**Proposed rear two-storey extension with reconstructed balcony and balustrade-. after a site visit and discussion, a vote was taken to support the application proposed by Cllr Hawkins; seconded by Cllr Bos, all in favour. The following comment to be submitted to EDDC - The PC fully support this application. This extension will be a vast improvement to the property making an unfunctional space into a multi-functional space.

To consider Planning Application 21/2045/FUL – Land North of the Shrubbery Escot Park – Amended plans for consultation – After a discussion and listening to the comments from residents and the Applicant a vote was taken to stand by the original comments submitted to EDDC. It was also proposed that tree screening would improve the site and help with noise levels and also that the proposed use of quieter cartridges be stipulated if permission was granted .Proposed by Cllr Lenehan; seconded by Cllr Gray. The Chairman to word a response for EDDC.

**To discuss Queen's Green Canopy and Jubilee celebrations**- a committee has now been formed and plans are taking shape. Cllr Andrews to seek permission for a beacon to be sited at Rydon Farm. The PC discussed the use of the monies from the Green Fund to be used for the Jubilee celebrations. A vote was taken to agree the use



of the money with any funds remaining being returned to the Reserve Account. Proposed for approval by Cllr Hawkins; seconded by Cllr Bos, all in favour. The Clerk to open a separate account for the money.

**Parish Maintenance**- The new Highways Officer met with Cllr Peters to look at the road between Rydon Farm and Blue Anchor. He has recommended that the whole drainage system be looked with a view to repairing that section of road. Items to be reported

- Rydon Farm through to Blue Anchor potholes
- Pothole down from Rydon Cottages towards Rydon Farm
- Pothole from Beacon Cross to Larkbeare approx. 200/300meteres from Beacon Cross
- Pothole near Bittery Cross going towards Rydon
- Potholes– Talaton Farm bend towards Escot
- The trees that were planted in the gap in the hedging down from Beacon Cottages have died, Clerk to contact Highways.

**Matters of urgency-** Following the appearance of a sign to the Church appearing on the bench at the top of Church Lane it was suggested that a proper sign could be placed on a pane in the BT box. Proposed by Cllr Hawkins; seconded by Cllr Wood, all in favour. A portacabin has appeared in the field between the railway bridge and Ivy cottages. The Clerk to contact the owner and ascertain the purpose of the cabin.

### **Talaton Community Shop**

Talaton has lost two well-loved members of the community, both of whom had a strong connection with the Shop and will be greatly missed.

**Graham Bidgood** passed away on 22nd January. Graham was an Area Manager for the Normans group of wholesalers (cash & carry) for many years. With strict sales targets to meet, this is where Graham honed his skills. He went on to run his own shop in Ottery before starting a mobile business driving his van and trailer around the local villages selling groceries, fruit and vegetables. As a consequence, he became a very well-known figure. When ill health forced him to give this up, he took up parttime work for the frozen food specialists, Taylors in Ottery, delivering their fresh produce.

When they closed this side of their business, Talaton Community Shop were at a complete loss because Taylors had been our supplier for several years, but Graham stepped into the breach immediately and became our new supplier of fruit & veg. He soon joined our team of volunteers and later became a member of the committee where his knowledge of retail and his passion for sales made him an invaluable member of the team.

**Jean Hofmann** passed away on 2<sup>nd</sup> February. She moved to Talaton in 1990 with her husband, Peter, and quickly joined in village life, playing the organ at St James the Great for many years and directing the creation of all the tapestry kneelers which are still in use today. Many ladies enjoyed the monthly Supper Club she organised in the Talaton Inn.

Jean was a founder member of the committee that worked to reopen the Village Shop in 1994, working hard to build up the foundations of the Community Shop we now have 28 years later. In 2012, when Jean could no longer work in the shop, she never ceased to be a staunch supporter and regular customer.



March has arrived at last and weather permitting, it should be the time to start planting many of those seeds you have bought. Well some of them at least, broad beans, broccoli, cabbage, leek, peas and spinach will all germinate at fairly low temperatures, but don't be too impatient, there are 31 days in March and hopefully the ground will warm up even more. It is a good time for onion and shallot sets and your last chance to plant garlic if you hope to get a good harvest this year. It is also time to plant first early potatoes.

Trim up perennial herbs such as rosemary and sage and propagate chives and mint by digging them up, dividing them and replanting. Regarding mint, it can be a thug so keep it's roots constrained. I will admit it again, that planting my mint in a damp place where I knew it would be happy, was one of the many foolish things I have done!

If you still have time on your hands you could begin to prepare beds for sowing and planting in April. If the weather is kind to us it will also be kind to aphids and caterpillars. They will thrive on new leaves so it is well worth keeping an eye out for them and acting before they have multiplied.

If you are still planning to plant bare root fruit bushes or trees it really is your last chance this year, while they are still dormant.


Don't forget to check your rhubarb, if you put cloches over it. Then what about sitting back to enjoy the first tender crop?


Remember to keep encouraging the birds. Many will repay your kindness by reducing the insect pests in your garden throughout the year.

### About "Talaton - A War-Time Refuge"


Wow! Did all of this really happen in Talaton? A most amazing story is being brought back to life. These events, almost forgotten, can once again now be known about. You simply can't live here in Talaton and not see this play – find out what happened here, in this village, between 1939 and 1946, re-live the events that occurred here all those years ago.

The play tells the true story of six of the twenty-three Polish Jewish children who were evacuated from Poland, on the Kindertransport, just before the outbreak of World War Two and were 'homed' in Talaton. The play, written by Tom Samson, is based upon extensive research, family archives and first-hand interviews with some of those whose stories are retold through the drama.

The story is obviously set against the backdrop of war-torn Europe but shows how, in a small Devon community, young lives could be transformed through understanding, care and, ultimately, love. In the words of one of the children homed in Talaton and recently interviewed for this production, "All of our lives were touched and changed forever by the kindness of poor, simple country folk who had little money for themselves but opened their homes to give us shelter, care, love and hope for the future."

This is the story of the Kindertransport children as it happened in Talaton. This story, in various ways, was to repeat itself throughout the country. It is a story where the 'first-hand experience' has almost been forgotten, leaving us with the dry historical details of those events. Through the words and writings of the survivors, the contributions of their families and the projection of archive photographs and documents during the performance, this ultimately uplifting story is brought back to life and once again made known. It is also a story that speaks to us today, as once again, as a country, we have to confront the issues concerned with vast numbers of refugees seeking sanctuary away from the horrors of their own homes. Copies of the play, which is historically accurate, will be available to purchase at the performance.

For this production we will be transforming the 'Christmas Barn' at Cotley Farm into an open, airy, enclosed theatrical venue. We will be bringing into the venue comfortable seating, major stage setting, lighting and sound as well as a projection system. There will be a licenced bar open from 7.30pm and during the interval and after the play. Tickets for this production are being sold by row and number and the box office is online – see the poster for full details. The sooner you get your tickets the better choice of seats you will have. Tickets will be on sale from mid-March.



### Rainfall at the Cobblers & Parish Hall 100 Club

### Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton during January

The weather in January started quite mild, but then turned much colder. There were long speels of dry weather over all the UK except in Scotland, and much of the North West. The mean temperature was a little above those of 2019 and 2020. The rainfall was a third less than average (except for Scotland). A maximum temperature of 16.3C was recorded on the 1st in St. James's Park in London, and the lowest of -8.0C in Topcliffe in North Yorkshire on 6th. On the 8th in 24 hours 64.8 ms or nearly 3 inches of rain fell at Honister Pass in Cumbria. Snow to depths of 4 inches fell on each day from 5th to the 8th in Ross and Cromarty in Scotland.

Here in Talaton I recorded 43ms or 1.72 inches of rain for the month. There were 22 days without rain, 14 of which had night frosts. From  $10^{\rm th}$  to the  $31^{\rm st}$  there were only 2 days with rain which only amounted to 3ms

Our total is therefore 1.72 inches.




