Things to do in the garden

planting.

Weather permitting, it should be time to start sowing many of those seeds you have bought. Well some of them at least, broad beans, broccoli, cabbage, leek, peas and spinach will all germinate at fairly low temperatures, but don't be too impatient, there are 31 days in March and hopefully the ground will start warming up enough for lots more. It is a good time for onion and shallot sets and your last chance to plant garlic if you hope to get a good harvest this year. It is also time for first early potatoes.

Trim up perennial herbs such as rosemary and sage and propagate chives and mint by digging them up, dividing them and re-

If you still have time on your hands you could begin to prepare beds for sowing and planting in April. If the weather is kind to us it will also be kind to aphids and caterpillars. They will thrive on

new leaves so it is well worth keeping an eye out for them and acting before they have multiplied.

If you are still planning to plant bare root fruit bushes or trees it really is your last chance this year, while they are still dormant.

Don't forget to check your rhubarb, if you put cloches over it. Then what about sitting back to enjoy the first tender crop?

Please remember to keep encouraging the birds. Many will repay your kindness by reducing the insect pests in your garden throughout the year.

Community Theatre 4All was formed in September 2015 and draws its membership primarily from the villages of Talaton and Whimple. Initially formed as an adult group its first production was the musical "Godspell", which was performed in St Mary's church Whimple in March 2016.

A wide range of theatrical work followed and in early March 2020 the group performed its second musical "Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dream Coat", also in St Mary's church. This production, which had a cast of 50, comprised of 30 adults and 20 children, became the foundation upon which the youth section of Community Theatre 4all was built.

Following a lengthy pause, caused by Covid, Young Community Theatre 4All was formed in September 2022. Since this time the group has experimented with a wide range of theatrical productions. These have included a devised piece based upon the children's book "Where The Wild Things Are", followed by the musical "Rats!" which told the story of The Pied Piper of Hamelin. In March 2024 the group performed a specially written play, "The Little Prince" which was based on the book of the same name by Antoine De Saint-Exupéry. In July 2024 the youth group joined forces with the adult group to give a series of open-air performances of the classic story "Toad of Toad Hall".

"The King of the Golden River", the group's fifth production, is based upon the book of the same name by John Ruskin and has been especially written for the company by Tom Samson.

Kaisha Reporting - Hello Talaton

It's been a while since I last updated you on my adventures from Talaton to circus school, to travelling around the world.

It's been nearly 3 years since I left Montreal and began work for the first time; travelling all over the world with a circus company called Les 7 Doigts, in which I finished my contract with them in December of 2023.

Which brings us to now. I started with another circus company called Cirque Le Roux in the summer of 2024, who are based in France, which means that my work now brings me to Europe, and even closer to my family here in Talaton. We are performing in a show called 'Entre Chiens et Louves', (Between Dogs and Wolves), and we've already performed at a summer circus festival in Prague and worked for 4 months from September to December in Paris. We are currently on tour around the south of France and visiting 13 towns/cities including Aix-en-Provence, Martigues and more towns close to Marseillle until June 2025. Then I will be popping over to New York in June/July to perform my old show Passengers with Les 7 Doigits.

In this show between dogs and wolves I specifically throw people in the air, and catch them. I also do contortion, which consists of bending my body in half, and also, singing! Singing was a skill I didn't pursue until my very first show with Les 7 Doigts after graduation, where my character had to sing a sad ballad straight after performing the act. It took a lot of practice as I'm used to using my body to perform, rather than my voice.

As odd of a job it is, gymnastics was sometimes that not only kept me busy after school, but it kept my mind at peace. I was able to put my unreleased energy into something I now make money from. I would say I'm pretty lucky to have had the facilities back then, and a super supportive family behind me. Because without them, I would be pretty lost with my direction in life; which can sound quite over dramatic, but I couldn't really see myself doing anything else.

Before I finish up, I want to thank the important people in my life, my family, my gymnastics coaches, circus teachers, and my friends.

Lastly, I would like to show my biggest appreciation for two teachers, who supported me inside and outside of school, with my aspirations and goals within my gymnastics

development, and personal growth of confidence.

rather than his usual imitation of the Dambusters bouncing bomb.



INFORMATION FROM THE MEETINGS OF 5TH FEBRUARY '25

TO CONFIRM DROP IN DATES FOR 25/26 - (26TH APRIL; 26TH JULY; 25TH OCTOBER AND 31ST JANUARY 2026) It was AGREED that the Drop-Ins should take place on the proposed dates

VE DAY 8TH MAY 2025 – UPDATE

The Talaton Inn was supportive of a 'Pie and Mash' night as part of the celebrations. The pub would open early for children and there would be other food available for them, as well as vegetarian options. The Council would be happy to support the event and the Chair would be willing to publicise it

GRANTS

<u>i. Consideration of Grant request from</u> <u>the Calendar</u>

Information had been circulated to all councillors regarding the late grant request for £500. After much discussion it was **RESOLVED** to make a grant payment to the Calendar of £500.

ii. Update on repayment of previous grant (not used by recipient)

The Clerk had received an assurance from the recipient, that the grant of £100 would be repaid shortly

Verge Cutting

The Clerk had written to the parishioner (who had been maintaining one of the parish verges) thanking him for his hard work but also asking him to stop (as the Council paid a contractor to do the work who had the necessary public liability insurance). The parishioner understood the reasons he had been asked to stop and had therefore agreed to discontinue with the maintenance work

HORTON AND PAYTHERDEN SO-LAR FARMS – UPDATES AND FUR-THER CONSIDERATION OF RE-QUEST FOR A MEETING

i.Horton

A parishioner had requested a meeting in response to Chloe Hood's (Aurapower) offer to attend a meeting later on in the year when she had a more confirmed construction plan. It was **AGREED** that a meeting should take place but it should be a public meeting and not included within a council meeting. Arrangements to be made when further information was received from Chloe.


ii.Paytherden

In response to the Clerk's request for a funding update, Paytherden had advised that they were waiting to hear from Bluefield who were putting things in place to build the project (which would take some time). They would be contacting relevant stakeholders and prospective beneficiaries of the project in due course

GRIT BIN REQUIRED IN VICINITY OF ORCHARD CLOSE – UPDATE –

Ed Polding DCC Highways Officer advised that it was DCC policy that grit bins were not placed along the primary salted network and therefore a bin could not be placed at Orchard Close. The bin would have to be placed at the roadside so that it could be filled. He suggested that DCC could arrange for the grit bin near Bluebell Cottage to be moved to the verge opposite the footpath near to the telephone box and bench

The Clerk in the meantime had contacted EDDC to see whether any of the S106 funds could be used for the purchase of an

additional grit bin but was advised that this would not meet the criteria for funding. She had also contacted DCC Cllr Chubb to ask if Locality funding could be used for an additional grit bin but Cllr Chubb indicated that he was unsure whether the Fund would be available next year. After much debate it was **RESOLVED** to ask DCC to relocate the grit bin to the location suggested, subject to there being no cost to the Council *Proposed by the Vice Chair and seconded by Cllr Wood*

DCC LOCALITY FUND APPLICATION- UPDATE

The Council had been successful with its application to DCC and £500 had now been received. The decorator advised that he would carry out the work to the phone box and benches when the weather improved

ENGLISH DEVOLUTION WHITE PAPER

The Clerk advised that at the moment there was little information as to what the district councils were considering with regards to the White Paper other than the following:-EDDC did not support the delay of local elections and the creation of one unitary authority. DCC supported the delay of local elections. However it was reported today that local elections will now take place. Concerns were expressed that reserves of the district councils may be swallowed up for big infrastructure projects (not necessarily in East Devon but elsewhere in the county): it was likely more services would be undertaken by parish/town councils eventually. however there was no information at this stage as to whether any changes were planned for parish councils; merger of small parishes was mentioned but again no firm information; it was likely parishioners would become more reliant on parish councils dealing with their queries rather than them attempting to contact and deal with a large unitary council. It was agreed that parish councils in rural communities played a significant role in their communities so their retention was important.

i.Planning application 21/2045/FUL Change of use from agricultural land to
outdoor leisure pursuits and associated
operational development - Land North Of
The Shrubbery, Escot Park Ottery St
Mary - Devon Country Pursuits Ltd Update

Andy Wood – Director of Place EDDC advised:-' the Council is currently seeking the agreement of the applicant/their agent to an extension of time to determine the application'.

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS RE-QUIRING ATTENTION AND AN UP-DATE ON ITEMS REPORTED AND TO AGREE ANY FINANCIAL PROVI-SION (IF APPLICABLE)

The matters relating to the water run off and debris on the road near Escot had been reported to Ed Polding DCC Highways Officer with photographic evidence but the Clerk had not received a response to her emails. In addition, the Clerk had reported to Ed the blocked drain near the telephone box (following on from the Chair reporting this) and again she had not received a response

Cllr Hirt had very kindly checked the drains in and around Talaton and had provided the Clerk with a map of locations showing the drains which were blocked (and which she had forwarded onto Ed). Ed expressed his thanks to Cllr Hirt and advised that he had added all the blocked drains to the list for jetting with the DCC contractor. He also advised that the drains which were on a primary salting network, would take priority over the others; thus the blocked drains outside Beech House and Orchard Close may be jetted first and the others at a later date.

Rainfall at the Cobblers

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During January

January's weather, according to the Met Office's records showed that the weather was very cold during the first two weeks of the month. There was a lot of snow in Scotland and the North of England, but none in Talaton. But the temperatures over all the UK were below average. Altnanharra, in Scotland was, (as usual) well below

everywhere in the UK with a horrid -18.9. Storm Elwyn blew in with gusts of wind well over 90 miles per hour, followed by storm Herminia which also brought high wind and heavy rain to many parts of the SW and Wales.

Rainfall however varied widely over the UK, with some areas well below, but some including parts of Southern England seeing over 100% of their usual, Cornwall for instance recorded over 125% of its usual rain in January. Despite all that, January was sunnier than average with 61 hours of sunshine.

Here in Talaton I recorded 124 or 5 inches of rain for the month; 14 days with no rain and 4 days with a frost. As a point of interest Google tells me that parts of Chile, Egypt, and Saudi Arabia have less than 5 inches in a whole year, so let us be thankful for what we do get!!


