Surprising things you didn't know about plants


If you fancy taking a more active role do come along and chat to members of the committee. We do not bite!

In the meantime, don't forget to leave a few windfalls for the birds. Blackbirds and other thrushes love apples and might



eat a few slugs and snails while they are at it.

I know I am repeating myself but, if you are having bonfires, don't forget to check that no hedgehogs have taken shelter underneath before you set light.



There is still time to plant green manure if you have some bare ground. It will compete with weeds and add nutrients and humus to your soil when you dig it in in the Spring. Broad beans can be planted now to give an earlier crop next year. Beans planted now will not be as readily infested with aphids as those planted in Spring. It is not too late to plant sweet pea seeds and garlic bulbs, if you have not already done so. Prune apple and pear trees while they are dormant.

Finally a plea to all our members to donate produce, plants, gardenalia to our stall at the How D'ye Do. Nickie Bitschi will be happy to accept donations nearer the time, as will Pam Weston. All proceeds go to the Parish Hall and we like to do our bit.



CONSIDERATION OF THE FOLLOWING PLANNING APPLICATION:-

23/1304/LBC Applicant: Mr Jonathan Boles Agent: Rydon House Talaton Devon EX5 2RP

Replacement of 7 single glazed wooden sash windows with 7 double glazed sash windows. The windows will contain exactly the same number of panes as the existing (12 pane or 18 pane) and will to all intents and purposes look identical both internally and externally.

It was **RESOLVED** by all councillors (other than Cllr Peters who did not participate in the discussion or vote, in view of his interest) that they strongly supported the application, as the proposed works would improve the property; were environmentally friendly; would save energy (re climate change considerations) and would preserve the integrity of the building in view of the condensation problems with the current windows

UPDATE ON WATER LEAK OPPOSITE THE PARISH HALL

The Clerk advised that SWW and DCC's Enforcement Officer were carrying out further investigations of the leak. The Clerk was waiting for an update from SWW/DCC following a further visit by SWW last week and she would chase this up accordingly


UPDATE ON THE VILLAGE GREEN LEASE (THE MOOR); PAY-MENT REQUIREMENTS AND CONSIDERATION OF THE COUN-CIL'S OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE LEASE

A signed and dated copy of the lease which was for a term of 250 years had now been located and the PC had been provided with a photocopy. The Clerk had asked for an examined hard copy of the lease from the solicitors as it would be advisable to try and get it registered at the Land Registry. Councillors had been advised of their responsibilities of the PC under the lease

ALLOTMENTS UPDATE - ANY ACTIONS TO BE AGREED; CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL (IF APPROPRIATE) OF ANY QUOTES RECEIVED RE THE ALLOTMENT STRIMMING

The Clerk would be meeting up with the landowner shortly to go through the draft lease and to iron out any potential problems

SWW had offered to help partially fund or source some additional water storage/butts and, as a one off goodwill gesture, fill the storage from their site water supply. It was **AGREED** that a small party of councillors should meet with Jenny Eamer from SWW on site to try and progress this.



Talaton Parish Council Report Cont'd

CONSIDERATION OF COST OF REPLACEMENT PLAQUE FOR TREE ON THE MOOR

It was **AGREED** that further investigations as to the type of material appropriate for the replacement plaque (eg wood, metal, slate etc) needed to be made before the matter could be progressed

CHRISTMAS TREE REQUIREMENTS

It was **RESOLVED** that the Chair be tasked with purchasing the annual Christmas tree

TELEPHONE BOX AND FUTURE PLANS

There was much discussion. It was suggested that the telephone box could be converted into a mini library. The equipment currently in situ would need to be removed, if this suggestion was to be progressed. The equipment could be removed from the box and placed in the shed when councillors were around for the Drop-In on 28th October. The box would then need to be cleaned following which (if the suggestion of a library was progressed) book shelves would need to be erected in the box by a volunteer (sourced by the Chair, if possible)

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND FOLLOW UP ON ITEMS REPORTED

a. Update on requested quotes for grass cutting of two areas in the village - (Phone box area and area at the rear of Cllr Bos's house)

Both areas had already been trimmed, therefore no quotes were obtained by the Clerk


- b. The trimming back of the overgrowth on the railway bridge near Half Moon Farm The Clerk would now report the matter to Network Rail.
- c. The damaged wall at Orchard Close The stones could be removed and temporarily stored by the Council, as agreed by DCC. The Council's insurers advised of matters that needed to be adhered to if repairs were to be carried out by councillors or volunteers of the Council
- <u>d. Potholes etc</u> The potholes opposite Hilliside and in the vicinity of Beacon Cross/Escot had been reported to DCC by the Clerk. There were no others to report at the moment
- e. Water leak at Talaton Hill It was understood that this had now been repaired by SWW

Balsam 2023

June 22

TVT are fortunate that there has been growing interest in commercial company staff charity volunteering days. Simpkins Edwards accountants supported us with 11 intrepid alien invasive plant pullers – from 8.30am to past 5pm! In addition, one of the director's teenage sons was there for most of the day, although 'there by choice' might be stretching it! We were also delighted to welcome a local who has more free time on her hands having retired from a busy career in nursing. Hopefully she will become a regular – she certainly homed in on the balsam with only a brief id introduction!



Since May 8th the Tale Valley saw almost no rain at all apart from some overnight on June 19. The river level is holding up remarkably well, helped in part by a series of beaver dams in the Danes to Tuck mills stretch. These dams are also contributing to the healthy growth of a variety of fish by filtering out at

least a percentage of the harmful trace elements & chemicals unfortunately present in the river. The patches of river weed noted in previous years' reports however, have completely disappeared. Something to investigate!

From Danes to Tuck Mill was relatively clear of bal-



sam – further down stream it got steadily worse – Talewater, Escot and below were bad considering our sustained efforts. 5% was already in flower. Nevertheless, our stalwart volunteers did not waver and a fan-



tastic team effort will hopefully result in the July team finding considerably less. There were butterflies throughout, notably Commas, Skippers, Tortoiseshell and Meadow Browns, but the damselflies – the 'Beautiful Demoiselles' stole the show, being in pockets of abundance throughout the river corridor.

July 20

A wonderful turnout of 19 volunteers. Particular thanks to Simpkins Edwards and Thompson Jenner Chartered Accountants for encouraging volunteer days for their workforces. The day was overcast but July has been on and off rain, with very little sunshine - so overcast was fine. Groups were distributed throughout the 8 mile target area. The managing partner of SE was delegated to drop 3 volunteers at the confluence at Cadhay Bridge to work upstream until they met the team coming towards them. They climbed over the gate - saw a river, and started pulling balsam - a few hours later they reached Gosford Bridge - which is ¾ of a mile upstream, over the river Otter! At the other end of the catchment volunteers were enjoying seeing beaver dams, a kingfisher, assorted butterflies and damselflies, and one group of four watched a carefree otter on the Rydon stretch for about two minutes! The same group then set off a burglar alarm on a property at Talewater having seen balsam within their boundary! The owners were there in moments having seen them on cctv but were very understanding and kind about the trespass!

The balsam was less than last time upstream of Talewater but still disappointingly prolific downstream from there. However, there was very little by the end of the day! One team even had time to clean off the ever creeping grasses that smother the exquisite brickwork of the Clapperentale water meadows – restored over a decade ago but now on the biannual maintenance list.



August 24

2023 is proving to be an exceptional year for plant growth, and fruits and berries. Hedgerows and orchards are heavy with crop. Himalayan balsam too has burgeoned this year. I don't remember it being this prolific on the river Tale for almost two decades. We had the most volunteers in June and July that we have ever had and yet the balsam from Talewater to the confluence was abundant. The 200m stretch between the Clapperentale bridges was even cleared in



a separate outing between July and August by one volunteer and yet it was as bad as ever two weeks later.

Unfortunately, 12 cooperate volunteers who came last year and were keen to repeat, cancelled a few days before due to a business crisis. This left us with 6 volunteers for the morning and two for the afternoon. Nevertheless, we comprehensively cleared 3 miles of river. The river itself was in good shape – between us we saw a kingfisher, a kingfisher's vacated nest burrow, a dipper and several recently used dipper's nests under bridges, prolific beaver activity, an orb weaver spider – and a frog. River weed of at least 2 varieties was noted in several locations. We even discovered a mature, 30-40ft elm tree on the riverbank protected from the beetle carrying Dutch elm disease by dense hazel bushes surrounding the trunk.

The TVT is very grateful to all our volunteers and to DWT and WCRT for their continuing support – and to the parish councils and private donors who value our work and support us. Thank you All!





This junket was about laser clay shooting and hosted by Sanda Vallis of Devon Laser Clays; Sandra is a member of Talaton Clay Shoot, and she kindly invited the ROBOT to sample her new enterprise.

Choir set to pull out all the stops for a beautiful night of Baroque music



Exeter Philharmonic Choir will join forces with the Isca Ensemble and four talented young soloists for November's 'Music of the Baroque' concert in Exeter Cathedral, including Handel's outstandingly beautiful choral work *Dixit Dominus*.

The concert promises to be a particularly memorable event for choir member Sheena McCready, whose musician son, Fergus, will take centre stage playing the solo of Alessandro

Marcello's *Oboe Concerto in D minor*. Fergus McCready took up the oboe as a child following a voice trial at Exeter Cathedral, where his brother was a chorister. It was Exeter Philharmonic Choir's Associate Director of Music, Stephen Tanner, who suggested Fergus try the woodwind instrument and he hasn't looked back!

In the past year, Fergus has auditioned as Principal Oboe with Birmingham Royal Ballet, the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra and the Royal Opera House, resulting in trials with all three orchestras. Fergus has also played guest Principal with the BBC Symphony Orchestra, Philharmonia Orchestra and the Academy of St Martins in The Fields. Sheena McCready, who has sung with the Choir for many years, says, "I'm absolutely thrilled that Fergus will be playing in our 'Music of the Baroque' concert in November. I'd always hoped he might one day play



alongside the Choir, although I never dreamt he would be playing one of my favourite concertos as a soloist.

"It feels like we've come full circle as Fergus took up the oboe after playing his recorder to Stephen many years ago during a voice trial. November 4th will be a very special night for me and, I hope, for the audience too." Howard Ionascu, Exeter Philharmonic Choir's Director of Music, adds, "The choir's main work (and challenge!) is *Dixit Dominus*. For me, it sits alongside *Messiah* as one of Handel's sublime choral works. We will be joined by three outstanding professional soloists - sopranos Lucy Cronin and Ellie Sperling, a former Exeter Cathedral chorister, and also Martha McLorina.

"The concert will also include the familiar anthem Zadok the Priest, sung recently at the King's Coronation and at the crowning of monarchs throughout the centuries, and Vivaldi's popular Gloria. That sums up the concert really - an evening of glorious Baroque music." At full strength, Exeter Philharmonic Choir has around 100 members, and the Isca Ensemble has more than 65 experienced amateurs and some former professional players drawn from across the South West. Isca Ensemble Musical Director Roger Hendy says, "We are delighted to have this opportunity of teaming up with Exeter Philharmonic Choir to present what promises to be a very special Autumn programme of beautiful Baroque music."





TALATON PARISH HALL HIRE CHARGES

Main Hall £10 per hour Committee Room £5 per hour

Minimum hiring period is 2 hours and this includes setting up and clearing away. There is no additional charge for use of the kitchen or stage. A deposit is not required but the hirer will be expected to pay for breakages or any repairs required resulting from damage during the hiring period.

Discounted rates are available for regular users.

The rate for professional events is £20 per hour. For such events all tables and chairs will be set up as required and cleared away at the end of the event. The bar can be made available subject to negotiation.

Following are available for hire by Talaton residents for use away from hall:-

Cutlery & China - £10 Wine Glasses - £5 per box of 24
Tables - £1 each Padded Chairs - 50p each (internal)

Plastic Chairs - 25p each.

Gazebos 3mx3m - £10 ea (10 avail) Gazebos 6mx3m - £75 ea (2 avail)

All the above are per day.

In addition to the hiring fee a deposit is required for gazebo hire which will be returned if the items are returned in the same condition as that at the start of the hire period. The deposit for the 6mx3m gazebos is £100 and the 3mx3m gazebos is £50. Cutlery, China, cutlery and glasses must be washed prior to return.

HALL DETAILS

The Village Hall is ideal for all manner of occasions, including meetings, luncheon and dinner events, wedding parties, children's parties, fairs and concerts and exercise classes.

The main Hall is approximately 12.7m x 6.3m and can seat up to 100 people in theatre-style layout and up to 80 for dinners or lunches dependent on layout. Our licence also allows for up to 145 at standing only events.

There is a separate committee room measuring approximately 6.3m x 2.3m which can be hired on its own for small meetings etc.

The Hall benefits from a fully equipped kitchen with serving area, toilet facilities and a foyer. In addition, there are ample tables and chairs, a stage, and a lighting system for stage events.

Free WiFi is available.


STAGE

There is a stage with curtains, moveable stage steps, small room at the back for changing and toilet facilities.

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During September

The first 2 weeks of the month was hot and dry. I measured only 4.50 mls in the first fortnight! High temperatures of 30C were recoded over a lot of the UK. The hottest day was in Faversham in Kent with a record 33.5C this has happened only 4 times in the UK the most recent was in 1919. The intense heat brought on many thunderstorms where 20/30 mls. or well over an inch fell in an hour were recorded in many places. The second half of the month saw an abrupt change bringing in some very wet and windy conditions and a named storm Agnes.

The average temperatures were 2.2C above the average making the month the warmest the second warmest since 2006.

The rainfall here in Devon was variable but some places in East Devon experienced torrential down pours. The warmest place in the UK was at Faversham in Kent with 33.5C and the lowest of-3.5 was endured in Kinbrace in Southerland in Scotland on 13th On 20th 117mls or well over 4 inches fell in 24 hours at Honister Pass in Cumbria.

Here I Talaton we had a very wet period from 15th to 28th. There were 16 days with no rain and the monthly total was 118ms or 4.7 inches bringing our yearly total so far to 27.2 inches
