Talaton Parish Hall – 100 Club Changes

It has been almost 40 years since the Talaton Parish Hall (TPH) 100 Club was introduced and during that time there has been no change in the annual subscription.

At the latest AGM it was agreed the time has come to introduce a change, not only to increase membership numbers, but most importantly, to increase prize amounts so they are more in keeping with current day living costs. The name of the club will also change and be called the 100+ Club allowing more members to join.

Rather than enforce a change on current members there will be an option from 1st January 2025 to change to a new DOUBLE UP subscription, which as the name suggests, will double your prize money if you are a winner. Obviously, to make this viable the subscription fee will need to increase to £2 per month/per number. Anyone signing up to the new subscription will also be entered into a bonus Christmas Hamper Draw which will contain goodies for the festive season.

To help with the transition of this new subscription, existing or new members are asked to sign-up by 31st January 2025. This will ensure there are sufficient funds available to support the bigger prize amounts throughout the year and also help with the management of future subscriptions.



HOW TO SIGN UP

Existing Members

For existing members there are 3 options to sign-up to the DOUBLE UP subscription:

- Cash in your existing membership and use the remaining credit towards the new subscription (i.e. if you have 7 months left on your membership as of 1st January 2025 this will give you £7 credit which means your new subscription will cost just £17 for the year (£24 - £7 = £17)

Please come, this is a chance for all Newcomers to be introduced to all the various Village Organisations and come and see Father Christmas The Talaton Calendar has been running in its present format since the early 1990s. Both Arnie and I will be time expired soon!

Initially we set the costs for advertising as low as we could to encourage advertisers and we may still have some originals on board. The new format Calendar was printed at cost initially by John Carter when at Lashbrook Farm, and then by Larkbeare Services courtesy of Dennis Oakley. Following Dennis's death, this facility diminished. Arnie and I then started to print this by hand, purchasing printers and consumables and putting it together page by page in Arnie's conservatory.

In that time we kept the same philosophy in our advertising rates, and having kept costs low we built up a small back-up fund, which we have used to maintain matters since.

However this DIY system of printing could not continue and a change of printing method was found with professional printers who have been superb, and up until COVID costs were reasonable. But like all things costs are rising significantly and we now have to pass this onto the advertisers who support us so well.

Printing costs started at £140 per month and they are now £220. Advertisers have left us, down-sized their adverts, and donations have dried up recently. Since COVID we have lost money to the point of a thousand pounds this past year in advertising revenue.

Our reserves could keep the Calendar in print for a limited time, but we should not run them down to zero, and it cannot continue with the present level of advertising income.

To stay afloat our adverts need to be re-costed and a 50% initial rise will be applied in this year's bills which will be going out in November. We will have to raise them again next year simply to break even.

If the Calendar is to continue this shortfall has to be plugged and advertising is the only plug we have.

those tidying up jobs in the garden. Autumn colours are slow to arrive this year.

I know I am repeating myself but, if you do manage to have a

bonfire, don't forget to check that no hedgehogs have taken shelter underneath before you set light.

There is still time to plant green manure if you have some bare ground. It will compete with weeds and add nutrients and humus to



your soil when you dig it in in the Spring. Broad beans can be planted now to give an earlier crop next year. Beans planted now will not be as readily infested with aphids as those planted in Spring. It is not too late to plant sweet pea seeds and garlic bulbs, if you have not already done so.

I hope you enjoyed our pumpkin competition, whether as a competitor or a viewer and have been inspired to have a go next year.

INFORMATION FROM THE MEETING OF 2ND OCTOBER 2024

PUBLIC FIFTEEN-MINUTE OPEN FORUM

DCC Cllr Iain Chubb was welcomed to the meeting. He spoke about DCC matters but primarily about the meetings he had attended; the Devolution deal (which had now been signed off) and the increase in pothole repairs being carried out by DCC. Cllr Chubb would forward a full report of his DCC activities to the Clerk shortly. He reminded the Council to check that the Parish grit bins were full; that the Clerk to report the missing chevron sign again to DCC (and to copy him into the e-mail) and he advised of the Locality Budget which the Council could apply to, for funding for projects that met DCC`s criteria. He advised that the deadline for applications was February 2025.

EDDC Cllr Richard Jefferies had advised by e-mail that he had been working on representing the tier 4 villages in the area that have had housing allocations proposed as part of the local plan. He had also attended an East Devon National Landscape (formerly AONB) workshop as the EDDC Cllr representative and chair of the East Devon National Landscape Partnership

ALLOTMENTS UPDATE AND ANY ACTIONS TO BE AGREED

The Clerk advised:-


