

Meeting 6th October 20.21

Correspondence:

a. Items of correspondence:

Sandbags-. order placed for 50 sandbags to be collected from Manstone Depot and stored with Cllr Peters. The Clerk to order 1 dumpy bag of sand to be stored at Cllr Peters farm

Innovation & Resilience Fund- This recovery focussed fund is designed to support innovative projects that: support business diversification and the development of new and innovative products; enable carbon reductions and biodiversity enhancements; enable and safeguard high value jobs; offer inclusive opportunities to disadvantaged individuals. Project funding of up to £50,000 is available per individual business or organisation, with project funding of up to £150,000 available per collaborative bid. Notice to go on the Website.

b. Items of late Correspondence:

Planning Application. Wildwood, Escot- 21/2569/FUL-Conversion of agricultural field to car park and addition of a 125m hedgerow – Planning meeting set for 21st October at 7pm. Cllr Hawkins had declared a personal interest in this item and did not take part.

Horton Solar Farm, Whimple- public consultation – notice to go on the Website. Site visit – Councillors will not attend as not a convenient time.

Housing needs survey- letter from Devon Communities Together to say that the survey is going ahead and they have assured the PC that there will be no reference to the PC in the letter.

To consider Planning Application 21/2554/FUL – Heatherdale, Talaton- Cllr Hawkins declared an interest and will not take part in this item. Following a site visit and consideration a vote was taken with all Councillors in favour of supporting the application, the following comment to be submitted to EDDC – The PC fully support the application. The plans have been tastefully done and in keeping with the existing building.

To discuss appointment of Hall Rep- the PC will continue to send a representative on a rotational basis, with Cllr Lenehan remaining as the main point of contact.

To discuss strimming/grass cutting for 2020 – quotes to be obtained for next year and insurance checked.

Parish Maintenance- lots of potholes developing but not large enough to report yet. Finger post outside Talaton Inn – sign to Ottery and Fairmile is missing

The October sunshine was surprisingly warm when I planted my garlic this afternoon. Good weather to do all those tidying up jobs in the garden, but also good to just stand and admire the glorious yellow leaves of the hedge maple and paper birch and enjoy the rich colours of the hedgerows.

I know I am repeating myself but, if you are having bonfires, please don't forget to check that no hedgehogs have taken shelter underneath yours before you set it alight.

There is still time to plant green manure if you have some bare ground. It will compete with weeds and add nutrients and humus to your soil when you dig it in in the Spring. Broad beans can be planted now to give an earlier



crop next year. Beans planted now will not be as readily infested with aphids as those planted in Spring. It is not too late to plant sweet pea seeds and garlic bulbs, if you have not already done so. They can both over winter really well.

Next on the agenda is our AGM. Let's hope the same thing doesn't happen to us as it did last year, when we had to cancel arrangements and go for a postal AGM instead. I am glad to report that we have managed to book Sally Nex - the speaker we had hoped to hear- for our AGM in 2022. So fingers crossed that we are able to meet for this year's AGM in the Parish Hall on...

LOOK AFTER YOURSELF

It's no secret that since I retired from the Fire Service two years ago I have experienced a roller coaster of emotions following my diagnosis of aggressive prostate cancer. Sadly, I know there are many men and women within the community who can relate to these emotions and how cancer changes your life forever.

I'm not writing this article to gain sympathy, far from it as I have been blessed by an overwhelming about of support and love since my diagnosis, but to simply prompt anyone with a symptom to get checked out.

Since my diagnosis I have looked in the mirror on many occasions to ask myself whether I could have done anything to avoid where I am today. The questions I have asked include;

Q - Did I ignore the risks when I turned 50?

A - No, as I had a PSA test aged 53 which was classed as normal yet 18 months later I was diagnosed with aggressive prostate cancer. Based on this experience my advice is to get checked annually.

Q - Did I ignore the symptom of a small decrease in urination pressure?

A - No, as I reacted within a month of noticing this symptom but sadly it had breached my prostate by the time I had surgery. A prompt reaction to a symptom normally provides the best outcome.

Q - Was my lifestyle a potential trigger for the cancer?

A - I don't believe so as I had kept myself physically active and generally stayed within the boundaries of sensible eating and drinking. It is suggested that red fruit such as tomatoes, strawberries (Lycopene) has a health benefit to the prostate.


Q - Did my occupation put me at a greater risk of getting cancer?

A - Possibly yes, as there is growing evidence that cancer can be triggered by contaminants being absorbed through the skin, hence why farmers, mechanics and anyone else working in similar environments need to be vigilant. The simple fact is that whilst there may have been some contributing facts sadly it comes down to your DNA. That's why I am so passionate about cancer research so that one day scientists will be able to define who is most at risk and monitor them accordingly.

GET CHECKED

Gents in the community, even though seeing your GP is much harder than it used to be, please don't ignore your risk factors or symptoms. In many of the common cancers early detection and treatment provides the best possible chance of a curative outcome. The bottom line is you don't want to be faced with my situation whereby my life expectancy odds have been reduced severely and I now live with lifelong conditions.

Launching the next Community Theatre 4All project "Talaton – A War-Time Refuge" (The story of Kindertransport children homed in Talaton)

What a long time it had been between the end of that wonderful production of "Joseph" and the start of something new and exciting. The long-enforced break caused by Covid and successive lock downs had left us eager to get started on something new. So previous performers joined by new participants gathered in Talaton Parish Hall for a day of drama activities and a read through of the play.

During the morning sessions Tom lead us though a series of drama activities designed to get us working again, to shake off the cobwebs of inactivity and explore the themes contained within the play. By lunch-time the hall was alive with buzzing activity as we all developed ideas through improvisation and shared short drama scenes that we had created.


For the read through, in the afternoon, we were joined by a number of visitors and in particular two people who had contributed so much to Tom's research into this amazing story. One of those was Jane Pring, whose Grandmother, Amelia Shimell, had evacuated from London with her children at the outbreak of war. The other was Isa Webber, a very sprightly 91 year-old, who was one of the Kindertransport children who had lived in Talaton during and after the second world war. As we read through the play we discovered how important Isa's life was to the events re-enacted throughout the play. It was a real privilege to share the afternoon and discuss the play with her after the read through. Isa was very complimentary about the way in which "Talaton – A War-Time Refuge" had been written, bringing back to life many of the events from so many different sources.

Now the real work must begin, over the next few weeks the play needs to be cast and rehearsals will begin. Although by the time that you read this all the main parts will have been cast there may well still be the opportunity to participate in the production, as a member of the cast or helping with all the other aspects of production. We will need help with publicity creation and distribution, costume and prop making, set construction and set-up in the performance venue (which will be Cotley Barn) and Front of House and bar staff for every performance.

We look forward to sharing the play with audiences in April 2022.

Rainfall at the Cobblers & Parish Hall 100 Club

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During September 2021.

September was a reasonably settled month though there were some heavy down-pours. It was warm, in fact the UK mean temperature was up by 2.1 C, and the month was the 2nd warmest September in the series starting from 1884! The UK overall had 82% of the average rainfall.

A maximum temperature of 30.8C was recorded in Hartpury College in Gloustershire on the 7th, and the lowest of -1.4C was recorded in Aboyne (Aberdeenshire) on the 30th. On the 29th 76.6ms. or just over 3 inches of rain fell in a 24 hour period at White Barrow in Devon

Here in Talaton there were 20 days with no rain and not a drop fell in the first week, but on the $8/9^{th}$ 44ms or $1\sqrt[3]{4}$ inches fell in those 2 days. The next big down-pour was in the later part of the month when we had a further $1\sqrt[3]{4}$ ins which fell between $26^{th}/28^{th}$. This brought our total for the month to 93ms or 3.72 inches.

Our yearly total now stands at 30.18 inches.




