


We now have a Starlink connection for the Hall since the demise of our promised

EXETER VACCINATION CENTRE (ROYAL DEVON UNIVERSITY HEALTHCARE NHS FOUNDATION TRUST)

Good afternoon, I am contacting you as the Eastern Vaccination Service is partnering with Public Health Devon to offer free NHS Health Checks to local communities. We have a schedule of clinics across the area and would like to know how to advertise this service via parish newsletters and magazines to ensure the offer is being made equitably across the area.

To give some background, the **NHS Health Check** is a free assessment of your overall health and can help identify whether you're at increased risk of developing certain conditions, such as:

- Heart disease
- Diabetes
- Kidney disease
- Stroke

During the appointment, our team will also provide personalised advice on how to reduce the risk of these conditions.

You may qualify for a free NHS Health Check if you:

- Are aged between 40 and 74
- Have not had an NHS Health Check in the past 5 years
- Do not have certain pre-existing conditions (e.g. heart disease, chronic kidney disease, atrial fibrillation, diabetes, or high blood pressure)

A full list of exclusion criteria is available here.

If you are planning any community events in the coming months, or have any regular community groups where our service could be a valuable addition, we'd love to hear from you. Alternatively our team can be based at your venue to offer this service.

We're keen to explore collaboration opportunities and the team would be happy to discuss how we can support your community together.

TREES AND POTENTIAL ISSUES FOR PROPERTY OWNERS DUE TO THE HIGH SUMMER TEMPERATURES

This summer has been long, hot and sunny with minimal rainfall. Some trees have been struggling due to the unusual high temperatures. Rapid shifts from heat to moisture can cause cracks in limbs and bark as tree tissues expand unevenly. Deadwood may become heavier with rain, increasing the risk of unexpected branch failure. Combined with any undiagnosed decay or internal weaknesses from the dry period, this becomes a serious safety hazard, especially in public or high-traffic areas.

A tree becomes a hazard when it has a structural defect that may cause the tree, or a portion of the tree, to fall and injure people or damage property.

Landowners or occupiers need to regularly inspect and maintain any trees on their land that are adjacent to, or within falling distance of the highway. This includes trees in hedgerows and banks on private land.




THINGS TO LOOK OUT FOR IN AN UNSAFE TREE

Damage

Look out for:

- · splits or cracks in the trunk or branches
- branches that are broken or hanging
- sections of bark damaged or stripped to show the wood beneath some trees such as Plane or Eucalyptus naturally shed their bark
- soil movement around the base of the tree in strong winds.



III health or disease

Look out for:

- sections showing signs of rotting
- growth of fungi on the bark, wood or around the base of the tree
- foliage dying back or going brown for no apparent reason on evergreen trees, or out of season for deciduous trees

The legalities of tree ownership

- · A tree is owned by the landowner on whose land the trunk originally grew
- The central tenet of tree ownership is that owners should take 'reasonable care' to ensure their tree is not causing harm or injury to neighbours, or damaging their property. Failure to do means they have been negligent, and could be liable for any damage, injury or harm caused if it was 'foreseeable'. For example, if a dead branch has been heard creaking in the breeze over a few months, and this branch falls through the roof of a neighbours shed, the tree owner is liable because the shed was damaged due to a breach of the tree owner's duty of care to their neighbour. Similarly, if a tree owner was advised their tree was dangerous and did not take action to have it made safe, they are liable for injury or harm it causes.
- Property owners should undertake tree inspections to keep an eye on the health of their tree(s), either themselves or through hiring an arboriculturist.
 There are no set rules for the regularity of inspections or whether it is always necessary to employ a professional - this is down to the judgement of the tree owner. If in doubt, consult a professional.
- The central tenet of dealing with trees that encroach on your property is that, whilst you have a right to cut back the parts of a neighbours' tree to the property boundary, you must exercise 'reasonable care' when doing so and you are liable for any damage caused to the tree. It is well worth hiring an arboriculturist contractor if you are not confident in your use of the equipment or processes.



The ROBOTIC Few

Small in number but huge in heart and gusto! Well, nearly a crowd but of the original five, four of us managed to find the right car park whilst number five chose a different park and had a fight with the RingGo. We did eventually all unite and hit what was the old Tiverton and Exe Valley Railway Branch Line. Thank goodness when it was closed in 1964 someone had the foresight to retain it as a walk and cycle path. It must have been a fun ride on the old steam train but now it is a level, quiet, tree covered track with just the sound of birds – Oh, and the occasional cur!



Eventually, the cleared track finished and climbing up a stairway we emerged on a really quiet lane. Looking over the brick bridge it's still possible to make out what would have been the route of the old track. Moving down the road – in the sunshine, too – we found the way down to the banks of the Grand Western Canal beside Manley Bridge. Being fit and hearty we ventured for nearly a mile away from Tiverton, passing moored canal boats, to the aqueduct. Here an excellent information board gave us the lowdown on the history of the railway, canal and aqueduct. It seems the coming of the railway finished off what was a busy canal whilst ultimately our friend Beeching finished off the beautiful rail branch line. Fully informed we turned round and followed the canal back towards Tiverton Basin. Wonderful flora and wildlife, particularly noisy moorhens and broods (got it right Garry!) of ducklings. Interesting seeing the grooves in the bridge walls rubbed out by the old canal boat ropes. We stopped to look at a somewhat sad information board detailing the crash of a plane at this spot in the 1960's with the death of two young airmen. And hey, the famous canal horse drawn barge appeared moving sedately – very slowly, actually, with its full passenger load. Beautiful horse in all its finery pounding its huge hoofs on the tow path. Seems they don't turn the barge around but tow it backwards!



A very observant ROBOT felt that if we didn't arrive at the café before the barge then we would be at the back of the queue of some 100 people! We moved quickly – mind you, it was not difficult to remain ahead of the barge – and secured a table in the garden to settle for very healthy pasty and chips and have our 10-minute discussion of our respective health problems. UPDATE ON ACTION REQUIRED (IF ANY) FOR THE GRIT BIN NEAR THE TELEPHONE BOX AND TO CONSIDER THE ROADWAY ADJACENT AND IF FURTHER ACTION IS REQUIRED

After much discussion it was **AGREED** that the grit bin should remain in situ. The responses from SWW regarding the road works and the further delayed date for the commencement of the works were noted by the Council

UPDATE ON ESCOT MATTERS INCLUDING CONSIDERATION OF REPORT FROM WILDWOOD RE ESCAPED BEARS

a. Escaping Bears

Paul Whitfield of Wildwood advised:-

Wildwood have been working closely with East Devon District Council in relation to this incident. Wildwood Devon has a zoo licence that is granted and enforced by the council. Following the incident there was a Section 11 Special Zoo Inspection that took place on 1 July 2025. That was attended by:

- Emma-Jayne Weston, Animal Health & Licensing Officer, Environmental Health/Environmental Protection, East Devon District Council; and
- Dr Matt Hartley DEFRA Appointed Vet Inspector.

Following the inspection, a number of directions were given to Wildwood including the review of safe systems of work, retraining of staff and updating the emergency procedures. All the directions have been now been fully complied with. The inspectors were confident that Wildwood had taken the incident seriously and that steps have been taken to ensure that it will not happen again.

Our internal report is confidential and can't be shared. However, full details of all the circumstances around the incident have been shared with the zoo inspectors and I would be happy to put you in touch with Emma-Jayne if that would be helpful'?

Further information had been received from Emma-Jayne Weston - Animal Health and Licensing Officer at EDDC

Emma-Jayne advised that the issue at Wildwood was human error. `The whole incident did not exceed 1 hour. An inspection was carried out within 24 hours of the incident by myself and a vet inspector, to establish how the incident had occurred and to ensure Wildwood's licensing conditions were being complied with. Escape drills/staff training etc were looked at. Adjustments have been made to the licence with further requirements re safe systems of working and further training of staff.

The recall system of ringing a bell worked which resulted in the bears going voluntarily back into their enclosure`.

The Council noted this information

b. Update - re the planning application at Escot Ref. No: 21/2045/FUL | Validated: Fri 30 Jul 2021 | Status: Awaiting decision Expiry date:- 2/11/22 - Change of use from agricultural land to outdoor leisure pursuits and associated operational development. Land North Of The Shrubbery Escot Park Ottery St Mary

Andrew Wood – Head of Planning at EDDC had advised the Clerk that the Case Officer in relation to the application had been away on leave but was back next week and he would chase this up then.

Cllr Richard Jefferies was also chasing up this matter

c.Ed Polding DCC Highways Officer re the water run off from the fields at Escot Ed has advised:- `I have been told by the management company that as well as the different field usage, the field will be ploughed horizontally to help prevent the runoff. Let's hope the new crop eventually helps to reduce the severity of the issues we have had here in the past. I will keep an eye on the situation when the at the beginning of winter`

DCC RESPONSE RE 20MPH SPEED REDUCTION IN TALATON AND TO CONSIDER THE PROVISION OF A VEHICLE ACTIVATED SIGN (VAS) IN THE PARISH

DCC had confirmed that Talaton has not been selected for a 20mph speed reduction area. A parishioner had suggested Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) be installed instead. The Clerk had explored this option. However the information provided by Ed Polding DCC's Highway Officer indicated that a VAS would be too costly and was not affordable by the Council. After some debate if was **RESOLVED** not to proceed further with this project due to cost

PARISH MAINTENANCE: ITEMS REQUIRING ATTENTION AND UPDATE ON ITEMS REPORTED AND TO AGREE ANY FINANCIAL PROVISION (IF APPLICABLE)

- i. Ivy around telegraph pole (DP 247) at the bottom of Rosemary Lane BT advised 27th July that it was not willing to come out as they considered ivy was not dangerous. They would only remove it in the event of works being required to the pole (and in order to effect the works, the ivy would need to be removed). BT suggested the owner of the ivy should trim it back. The Clerk had looked at Land Registry records and it appeared that the land on which the pole was sited was not registered, so ownership was not known
- ii. Pot holes All pot holes were reported to DCC by the Clerk. They had to meet a criteria to be repaired. If someone in the village was willing to volunteer as a road warden (which would mean being trained by DCC)

he/she would then be insured to fill in minor pot holes etc. However previous requests by the Council for a road warden, had not generated any positive responses.

- iii. Village Green It had been requested that a section of the village green be used to widen Rosemary Lane in view of larger vehicles parking there and other vehicles having problems negotiating around them. As the Village Green was protected, then the Council would not be willing to follow up this suggestion
- iv. Water leak outside the toilets at Talaton Inn reported to SWW by Clerk on 27th July. SWW advised that they would get one of their inspectors to investigate and carry out any necessary repairs. It was understood that SWW were currently carrying out works in the area and that there had been an unpleasant smell (presumably coming from the drains). It was understood that SWW was 'on the case'.
- v. The overgrown hedge running from Bankside to Orchard Close had been reported to EDDC by the Clerk by email 27th July. EDDC advised 26th August `An outside Contractor has been requested to cut this back as Streetscene do not have the capacity to undertake these works `. Cllr Walker advised that the work had still not been carried out.
- vi. Problem property at Hillside garden overgrown etc The Cler requested on 27th July that EDDC should provide an update as to when the garden etc would be cleared. A further reminder was sent by Clerk on 13th August. EDDC advised 26th Aug'it is with the voids team (Kim Slater) and we have requested to cut back the garden asap- Apologies for the delay. The Vice-Chair was unhappy with this response. The Clerk would contact EDDC Cllr Jefferies to see if he could expedite matters
- vii. Broken manhole cover in road opposite Hillside DCC advised that an assessment was being carried out
- viii. Network rail advised that the ivy growing on the brickwork of the railway bridge near the allotments presented no concerns and the next vegetation clearance would be in 2027
- ix. Ed Polding has advised that the verge running from Sunhaven to the Newtown junction did not qualify as a safety defect (height of grass) and no further action would be taken by DCC
- x. A report on Talaton Talk advised that `The rivets have come undone and it won't take much more wind to break` (in relation to the finger post at the Newtown Junction). The Clerk would relay this matter to DCC via its website

A site visit had taken place. Following this it was **RESOLVED** that the following comments be submitted to EDDC – `Talaton Parish Council approves the application. We are happy to see that the concrete rendering is to be replaced with lime rendering. However in our opinion the windows desperately need replacing with suitable double glazed windows which are environmentally suitable and will also provide adequate sound proofing`
