

Talaton Parish Council Report

The following are major items from the minutes but a full copy of the minutes may be viewed on both Parish Noticeboards and on the Parish Web site www.talatonparishcouncil.co.uk

Planning Meeting 11th August

Five-minute open forum – 11 members of the public present. An extended public session took place to allow residents to share their concerns with regard to Item 3 Planning Application- Escot Park. Various issues were raised with the main concern being the noise levels from the clay pigeon shooting and the environmental issues with noise and air polution/arising from the go karting track. Residents also pointed out that this is the 2nd fairly large-scale development on Escot that had gone ahead without planning permission. It was felt that the application lacked detail

The duration of the hours (9am-6pm) 7 days a week for the Karting and clay pigeon shoot was also a cause for concern as the Quad bikes are already exceeding their running time of 6pm.

It was pointed out that although DCP say they use 410 guns they have also been known to use 12 gauge. There was also concern over the amount of shot lying on the public footpath which is 300 meters from where the shoot takes place. Concern was also raised that interested parties were not notified as stated by Savills in the planning support statement. Residents felt that if guns were altered to sub sonic levels and that was made a planning condition then the local residents would be happy with the clay pigeon shoot.

Apologies for absence- Cllrs Hawkins and Wood due to personal interest in Item

To consider Planning Application - 21/2045/FUL- Land North of The Shrubbery Escot Park - Change of use from agricultural land to outdoor leisure pursuits and associated operational development- following a site visit and listening to residents' concerns Councillors considered the application. A vote was taken with 4 Councillors objecting and 1 abstention. Objection proposed by Cllr Lenehan, seconded by Cllr Bos The PC will Object to the Planning Application. The Chairman to draft a response for Planning detailing the concerns raised following the site visit and after considering the concerns from residents of the neighbouring properties.

Meeting 1st September



Items of correspondence

1. Lees Meadow- the Clerk and Councillors had been contacted by residents of Lees Meadow regarding the letter sent to residents by Tidewater to say they were commencing building on the field at Lees Meadow. The Clerk had contacted the Enforcement Officer as the planning permission had lapsed. The Chairman distributed a letter to the residents stating that the permission had lapsed and to inform the PC if any work commenced.

The Clerk also contacted the Enforcement Officer over public concern over the erection of fencing on the site, the fencing is due to be adjusted and brought in from the verge and the height reduced. The owners of the land will be assessing the site to see if it now becomes suitable within a revised Housing needs assessment.

To discuss Housing Needs Survey- following a letter from Devon Communities Together asking if the PC would support a housing survey on behalf of Sutherland Property & Legal Services, on behalf of their client, Councillors considered the matter. The PC received a copy of the proposed survey and felt that the questions were intrusive and it was unacceptable to ask questions relating to financial matters. Concerns were raised that the survey may appear to have come from the Parish Council, similar to the last survey where the PC had to distribute leaflets to each house stating that it was not from the PC. It was proposed that the PC does not give its support to the survey. Proposed by Cllr Lenehan, seconded by Cllr Hawkins, all in agreement.

Parish Maintenance: Items requiring attention and update on items reported – Cllr Peters was appalled at the workmanship and the way the repairs had been carried out on the bend between Rydon Farm and Blue Anchor. The Clerk to contact Highways and make them aware of the incident.

The following matters to be reported to Highways

Roman Road – 3 big potholes after Riverwood going towards Beacon Cross

Items for information only or discussion on the next agenda (Defibrillators-checks completed and registered with the new National Defib network, reporting now reduced to every 3 months. Clerk to order new adult pads to replace the pads that expire on the 25th.; Drop -In date – the next drop is Saturday 25th September 10.30am till noon, Cllrs Lenehan, Bos and Walker will be available; Escot parking—(Cllr Hawkins declared a personal interest) Cllr Lenehan had been contacted about parking facilities that were put in the field opposite Larkbeare Cross. Concerns over Dormice living in the hedge and the laying of the surface had already been reported to the EDDC Enforcement Officer and the site had been visited. The matter is now with the Enforcement section. Riverwood Farm – the temporary building is finally being moved off the site.








Young Community Theatre 4All A theatre group for children aged 8 to 13

We are looking for additional volunteers to help us with call handling. This role is a voluntary role and equally just as important as our volunteer rider & driver roles.


In a nutshell, the call handlers are responsible for taking call of incoming jobs, dispatching riders, and then keeping track of where they are and recording the relevant information from them.

Rainfall at the Cobblers & Parish Hall 100 Club

Rainfall at the Cobblers in Talaton During July & August 2021.

All areas of the UK were drier and much warmer than usual with very high temperatures in the middle part of the month. Northern Ireland set a new record of 31.3C or 83F which was the highest temperature since records began.

Here in Talaton it was like everywhere else, a month of 3 parts. The first 11 days produced 68m or 2.72 inches of rain; the second part from the 12th to 22nd there was no rain at all and it was HOT, and in the 3rd part 48ms or 1.92inches of rain fell.

This gave us a total of 116ms or 4.64 inches for the month and a total of 22.54 inches for the year so far.

The Met office tells us that the UK mean temperature was up by 1.5C and that it was the 5th warmest month overall. Many parts of Northern England and the Sottish Highlands had a wet month with many places having double their normal rainfall.

On 20th July 32.2C or well over 85F was recorded at Heathrow but poor old Braemar in Scotland had -0.1C. On 26th 87.9ms or 3.51 inches of rain in 24 hours.

August 2021

There was plenty of rain in the first part of the month, I measured 32ms or well over an inch between $1^{st}/9^{th}$. The second part was very dry with no rain here for 9 consecutive days, 3 days from $19^{th}/21^{st}$ was wet, but it was dry for the rest of the month.

Here there were 22 days in the month with no rain and the total rainfall was 48.1ms or 1.92 inches.

The Met Office tells us many places in the UK had a dry month with $\frac{1}{2}$ the usual rain fall. The UK overall had only 73% of the average August rainfall.

A maximum temperature of 27.2C (low 80s) was recorded in Tyndrum in Perthshire on the 25th and yet again Braemar in Aberdeenshire was the coldest place with a low of 0.3C or just above freezing on the 31st On the 9th 74.2ms or 2.96 inches of rain fell in 24 hours fell at Spadeadam in Cumbria!

Here in Talaton the overall total of rain for the year stands at 24.46 inches.

Community Theatre 4All

Restarts this autumn with two groups

(any possible remaining restrictions permitting)

The Adult Group

This group is open to performers aged 14 years and above and will be working on a play entitled "Talaton, A War-Time Refuge". This large cast play tells of the billeting of 23 Polish Jewish Kindertransport children in Talaton during the second world war and, in particular, re-tells the experiences of six of these children. The play, following extensive research, has been written by Tom Samson and is based upon interviews with and the writings of those six children and additional major contributions from their families. Extensive archive photographs and documents will be projected throughout the performances. This amazing and very uplifting story has almost been lost to memory and its recreation and the realization of all that the villagers of Talaton did during this time is certain to leave audiences in total awe and admiration of those who lived here at the time. This project will be launched at an Introductory Workshop in Talaton Parish Hall on Saturday 2nd October between 10.30 and 3.30. Attendance at the workshop does not commit anyone to participating in the production. Come along and find out for yourself and then decide if you wish to be involved. This workshop will include a full reading of the play during the afternoon session. Weekly rehearsals will take place on Tuesday evenings between 7.00 and 9.30 beginning on Tuesday th October.

The Children's Group - Young Community Theatre 4All

This group, which will meet in Talaton Parish Hall between 4.30 and 5.30pm, is open to children between the ages of 8 and 13. **The first meeting will be on Tuesday 5th October**. 


